Hoover City Schools will host two School Safety Community Meetings in March. The first one is March 6, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. at Spain Park High School. The second meeting is Thursday, March 8, 2018, at 6:00 p.m. at Hoover High School. Both meetings are identical in format.

Hoover City Schools Superintendent Dr. Kathy Murphy, Hoover Board of Education members, Police Chief Nick Derzis, Fire Chief Clay Bentley, City Education Liaison Derrick Murphy, Mayor Frank Brocato, and other school district and city leaders will be present for the discussion.

The meeting will allow the school district an opportunity to discuss safety efforts, at least to the extent that such discussion does not




Attention All Parents: To comply with Alabama's new <u>Erin's Law</u>, HCS school counselors and administrators have created a plan to provide basic child sexual abuse prevention lessons for students. We have prepared a brief <u>video</u>

PayPams- A Valuable Resource for You!

School Messenger was replaced with Blackboard in December. The low balance notifications were changed over; HOWEVER, the balance was not accurate to include the current day's payments/transactions. This caused much confusion and frustration for parents. In order to help you stay on top of your child's lunch balance, we encourage you to utilize the notification system in PayPams. We will soon be sending a phone bulletin of this feature in PayPams to help you learn more.

There is no charge to create and monitor an account. The only fee is if a payment is made online to your child's lunch account. Notifications levels can be set up at the parents preference: \$50.00, \$20.00, \$15.00, etc. This is a valuable tool and we hope you will take advantage of it to help you keep up with your child's balance.
