CLASSROOM CLIPS

MH - We are so excited that spring is here and are celebrating with our plant/flower language unit. Our sensory garden in the school courtyard will be spruced up by the herbs and flowers that we are planting to help us explore our 5 senses. We will be planting seeds and watching them grow. Our solar frog fountain is back up and running and we are looking forward to being able to spend time in this special area. We have also welcomed a new paraprofessional in our classroom, Aimee Pierce, replacing Mr. McQueen, who moved back to Auburn.

<u>Kindergarten</u> - We hope you had a great spring break! It was fun to hear of all of the kids' adventures and time with family. We will begin studying balls and ramps in the coming weeks, so if you see examples of these in the world around you, explore them with your kids! We are learning all about spring, insects, and plants. The farm field trip is on Friday the 20th. If you have not yet paid for the farm field trip, please log on to myschoolfees and turn in your payment.

<u>1st Grade</u> - First graders are getting excited about our Ruffner Mountain field trip. We are scheduled to go on April 13th. If you have not done so, please remember to pay for the trip on Myschoolfees.com. In reading, we are going to be studying theme, or life lessons learned from the books we have read. In math, we will finish up place value and number sense and move to solving addition and subtraction word problems.

<u>2nd Grade</u> - We are SO excited to be scientists in our classrooms conducting investigations to describe and classify various rocks according to physical properties. We are discovering that erosion of rocks happens over a longer period of time than one can observe.

<u>3rd Grade</u> – We hope you all had a wonderful, restful spring break! We were thankful to see everyone back safe and healthy! Third graders are still working hard on researching while reading. We are also learning about subject and predicates and persuasive writing. In math we will be reviewing subtraction strategies, as well as continuing our work on multiplication facts and fractions. Please keep practicing those multiplication facts at home! Please let us know if you have any questions or if we can help you in any way.

<u>4th Grade</u> – The awesome Rocky Ridge 4th graders have been working hard to prepare for the state testing that will happen on April 17–18. Luckily, they have worked hard all year and are confident that they can do their best! They have practiced complicated math problems, some that involve fractions, geometry and computation all in one problem. They've practiced reading passages carefully and answering questions using evidence they find in the text. They have also brushed up on writing grammar skills. Our 4th graders are ready to prove how much they have learned this year! <u>5th Grade</u> – 5th grade is preparing for testing next week! In science, we are conducting planet research. In math, we are reviewing multiplying fractions. We are learning about the events that led to the War for Independence in social studies. Finally, we are working on argumentative writing and debating in language arts.

Words of Learning Wisdom for all (by Instructional Support Team)

Movement in learning is a teaching method based on the concept that humans learn better through movement. This teaching method can be applied to students, who should have the opportunity throughout a class period to move around to take "brain breaks" to refocus their attention so they can learn new material.

Teaching lessons as active games also enhances attention and memory. How about a kinesthetic spelling bee in which your child spells vocabulary words by positioning his/her body in the shapes of letters?

Brain breaks are planned learning activity shifts that mobilize different networks of the brain. These shifts allow those regions that are blocked by stress or high-intensity work to revitalize. Brain breaks, by switching activity to different brain networks, allow the resting pathways to restore their calm focus and foster optimal mood, attention, and memory.

Brain breaks should take place before fatigue, boredom, distraction, and inattention set in for the student. Depending on students' ages and focus development, brain break frequency will vary. As a general rule, concentrated study of 10 to 15 minutes for elementary school and 20 to 30 minutes for middle and high school students calls for a three- to five-minute break.

Brain breaks do not require disruption in the flow of learning. Simply stretching, moving to a different part of the room, or singing a song can revitalize the brain.

Dear Parents,

The Scantron Performance Series will be administered to our third, fourth, and fifth-grade students beginning the week of April 9, 2018. Please see the back of this letter for the testing schedule. Please help us provide the best testing situation for your child to demonstrate his/her abilities. Please monitor your child's eating and activity levels during this time. Well-nourished and rested children are more alert and better prepared to meet the demands of standardized testing conditions.

Students will be taking the Scantron Performance Series in their classrooms on their Chromebooks. Other than taking the test on a Chromebook, the possession of digital devices (including but not limited to cell phones, digital watches, watches with alarms, MP3 players, cameras, mobile entertainment, social connections, navigation devices, or other telecommunication devices) are strictly prohibited in the testing setting. If a device is in the possession of a student in the testing setting, testing for that student will cease, the device will be taken up and turned into the office, the student will be dismissed from testing, and the student's test will be invalidated. Therefore, please make sure your child leaves these devices at home or if he/she need the device for after school, please make sure they are powered off and inside his/her bookbag. All bookbags will be left in the hallway during testing.

We also request your cooperation in assuring your child's prompt arrival to school each day. Due to standardized administration guidelines, no testing session can be interrupted once it has begun at 8:00. Any child who arrives late will miss the testing session for the day. Please make sure that any appointments for your child occur after 11:00 a.m.

Listed are some tips that will help your child to be better prepared for the Scantron Performance Series:

- 1. Ensure that your child gets plenty of sleep the night before the test and gets up early enough to avoid rushing.
- Try to prevent your child from participating in any strenuous or late-night activities during test week. 2.
- 3. Understand the importance of your child eating a good breakfast before taking the test.
- 4. Encourage your child to wear clothes on test days that are comfortable. Bring a jacket if they are worried about being cold.
- 5. If your child wears glasses, make sure he or she brings them to school.
- 6. Encourage your child to do his/her best without creating unnecessary pressure.
- Please arrange all appointments around testing times. Testing cannot be interrupted for checkouts.
- 8. Be sure your child has working headphones or earbuds for testing.

Thank you for your cooperation and be assured of our commitment to providing a positive learning environment for all of our students.

In our STEAM Lab classes, students will work together to explore the realms of science, technology, engineering, art, and math under the guidance of Ashley Waring.

2-5th graders learning what it takes it be a computer and how computers work. 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders are also reviewing mathematical practices through rigorous problem solving to help them prepare for testing after Spring Break.






