### **Attention** 1st Grade Parents!



The State of California requires all first grade students to complete a CHDP (Child Health & Disability Prevention) exam within 90 days of entry into first grade. If you have not already done so, you will need to schedule an appointment with your family physician for this check up. The doctor will fill out a special form (available in the school office if you want to take one with you to your appointment) and that form is then returned to the school. Questions?
