Book Fair...Please plan on attending our Scholastic Book Fair while attending conferences. The Book Fair hours will be 1:00-7:30 p.m. on Thurs., March 7th, and 8:00-11:30 a.m. on Fri., March 8th. Students will be able to purchase books on Wednesday, March 6th, during school hours.

Report cards will be sent home with students Friday, March 1st.

CMAS state testing will soon be upon us. Colorado Senate Bill 163 was created to have common assessments administered to third, fourth, and fifth graders. They take an ELA exam (reading and writing) and a Math exam. Fifth graders also take a Science exam. The State requires each school to have a 95% or higher rate of students taking the assessment. Our goal for Mesa is 100% participation! We are awarded points for meeting this goal which helps to determine our yearly Accreditation Rating. When a child is opted out, it goes against our Accreditation Rating. We are encouraging all Mesa 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade students to take CMAS this year. If you choose to opt your child out, you will need to write a letter and make an appointment to meet with the principal.

Excellent attendance ~ Being in school every day means your child won't miss out on learning. Try to schedule appointments and family trips outside of school hours. If he asks to stay home "just because," remind him of what he'll miss, such as his reading group or PE class. Explain that he can be absent only if he's sick or if there's a family emergency.
