

News from P.E.- Mrs. Brown

4th grade P.E. classes will be participating in the State of CT. Fitness Assessment during the month of October. The components of the fitness test are cardio/respiratory endurance demonstrated by completing a mile run; muscular strength and endurance demonstrated by completing curl ups and by completing right angle push ups; flexibility by completing the back saver sit and reach which tests the flexibility of the hamstrings and spine. Please encourage your 4th graders to practice their push ups at home. It seems to be an area of weakness for many students. Improving upper body strength can help support students efforts in many sports, enhance overall health and personal safety when participating in water activities. Please help by encouraging a healthy breakfast and a good nights sleep, especially on P.E. day. Thank you in advance for your help and support. We should complete the fitness test by the end of October.

News from Technology: Mrs. Ardolino

The new "MakerSpace/Tech Lab" is a huge hit with students! It is definitely a different class set-up than the old desktop and row formation from previous years. The students bring their Chromebooks to the Tech Lab; once the day's lesson/instruction is done, they can work on their assignments in a flexible environment. So far the Fourth and Fifth grade students have been introduced to Google Classroom (the younger students will get to try it soon!) and all gds. 3-5 students have been able to work in their Google Drives using Google Docs and Slides. Digital Citizenship and Digital Footprint concepts will be reviewed in the next few weeks. Students have really embraced the new technology and it is great to see how adaptable and collaborative the students have been with the new technology tools.
