Sun & Skin Safety

Warm weather means kids are spending more time outdoors. Too much time in the sun can cause pain and even permanent harm. Protecting yourself from ultraviolet (UV) rays can prevent damage.

1. <u>Minimize sun exposure</u> - It is best to limit time in the sun between the hours of **10 a.m. and 4 p.m**.

2. <u>Follow the shadow rule</u> - If your shadow is shorter than you are, it means UV rays are intense.

3. <u>Lather up</u> - Apply sunscreen 30 minutes before going outside, and reapply every 90 minutes or after sweating or swimming.

4. <u>It's not just for sunny days</u> - Water, sand and snow reflect the sun. Clouds only block 20 to 30 percent of UV rays.
