Meetings are held each year to review the compact and make changes based on student needs. Parents are welcome to contribute comments at any time.

- Link to goals of the School Improvement Plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress

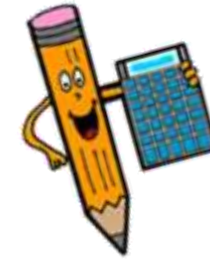
