## New School is on the Way!

School will end on May 7 so demolition of the old building may begin. We should break ground for the new building by end of May. Currently heat and air for the current gymnasium is being worked on and it is scheduled to be completed by May 1, in time for spring music program and graduation. The Board of Education will open bids on April 7. There are 41 bid packages and several more alternative packages.
Inventory of non-OSSAA trophies is being done and they will be for sale this spring. Also bricks from the old building and sections of the old gym floor will be available for sale. Watch for details on the website and in the Enid News \& Eagle.

The regular April school board meeting has been moved to April 15 to allow the BOE to work through the bid process.

Next year there will be many changes around KHS as the building goes up. Pre-K and Kindergarten will move back into the elementary building, middle school will move into the north side of the gymnasium complex, and portable buildings will house the high school classes and offices and they will be located in the parking area immediately east of the gymnasium.
