Picking Your Child Up from School at Dismissal

If a change in your schedule necessitates you having to pick your child up from school at dismissal, please let the school know by 1:00. This helps our staff have ample time to inform your child of this change.

Written Excuses Required for Student Absences

All students who are absent from school must submit a written excuse within 3 days of their return to school. If an excuse is not provided for the day(s) in question, those absence(s) will be marked as unexcused. An accumulation multiple unexcused absences may result in charges being filed with the district magistrate for violation of Pennsylvania school attendance regulations.

Ideas for Helping Students with Math Facts

Long-term success in mathematics is closely tied to strong number sense, including fluency with basic facts. The sooner your child becomes fluent with his or her basic facts from 1-10, the better.

Play math games - games help students learn their facts because students receive immediate feedback and repetition with correct answers and games are highly motivating.

Practice a small number of math facts at a time, then only add more facts to learn as the previous set has been mastered.

Practice by having your child say the whole problem and the answer aloud; such eight plus two is ten or three times four is twelve

Practice sessions should be short. Students sometimes struggle to stay focused on a drill for more than 2-4 minutes at a time.

Celebrate success! Your child will be motivated to learn math facts if parents show them it is important. Find ways to celebrate your child's success.
