

- Only males who have successfully completed their junior year of high school and have at least one more semester of high school remaining are considered eligible to participate.
- Only boys with outstanding qualities of leadership, character, scholarship, and loyalty and service to their schools and community should be considered.
- In the actual selection of boys as citizens of Boys State, merit and ability alone are the basis for selection.

Girls state: June 10 - 16 at Presbyterian College.

Palmetto Girls State is a one-week leadership and citizenship training program, created to further educate outstanding high-school students about state and local government. The delegates, who are all rising-seniors in high school, are selected for the program based on the leadership skills and involvement they have shown in their respective schools and communities.
