Fennell Elementary Received Grants to Provide Technology Support to the Community

Fennell Elementary Technology Center has received two grants from the Coastal Community Foundation of SC. The first grant was from The Beaufort Fund for \$7,500 and the second was from the Winthrop Family Allendale/Hampton Fund for \$5,000. The grants will enable the Technology Center to be open on Tuesday and Wednesday nights from 6 to 8 with a teacher



(Robbie White), a teacher assistant (Tonya Murray), and a student teacher assistant (Adonia Riley), to work with adults, elementary, middle and high school students. The grants will also cover printing supplies and replace a few obsolete computers. The program will run from February through the end of May. Adults will come in to work on basic computer literacy skills to improve their typing skills, work on community projects, fill out job applications, fill out FAFSA forms, practice for GED, or work on courses offered at TCL and other local colleges. K-12 students will be working on homework, writing and publishing school projects, improving typing skills, and working on educational websites.
