Behavior Number System

Our behavior number system that is used in classrooms focuses on students making good decisions and being responsible for their actions. Students rarely get a 7 because that means they have done something extraordinary that day. Thank you for working with us as we continue to acknowledge and encourage positive behavior. Gator Pride Points

Our Gallman Gators have been working hard to earn Gator Pride Points! Gator Pride Points are used to encourage students to display appropriate behaviors throughout the day. Students have the opportunity to redeem their Gator Pride Points at our Gator Gift Shop, or they can save their points for bigger rewards, such as 'renting' the principal's chair for the day. Make sure you ask your child if they have received any Gator Pride Points recently!
