Graduation Information & Expectations

Mid-Carolina High School will hold its graduation ceremony on Wednesday, June 5, at 7:00 p.m. in the Mid-Carolina High School gymnasium. As seating is limited, each senior will receive six (6) tickets for

family/friends to attend the ceremony in the gym. Seniors will also receive three (3) tickets for family/friends to view the ceremony from the overflow area in the cafeteria. (Due to fire marshal regulations a ticket will be required for each person.)

Graduation is an important event in the lives of our young people. In order to ensure that each student has a moment to remember without it being spoiled by others, the administration will implement guidelines to present an orderly and dignified graduation ceremony.

Please be aware of the following guidelines:
All doors will be locked at 6:45 p.m. If your family arrives after that, they will not be allowed to enter the gym.

- Security will be handled by school staff and uniformed police
- Unsolicited applause, catcalls, whistles, cowbells, sirens, or any other form of noise or noisemakers during the ceremony is inappropriate and will not be tolerated. Spectators who engage in such behavior will be asked to leave the ceremony.
- Spectators may take pictures and/or videos from their seats but should not hinder the sight of other spectators.
