### MCHS CLASS OF 2018 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Of the 172 graduates,

- 96 graduates received completer certificates from the Newberry County Career Center
- 81 graduates earned a Newberry County Advanced Diploma
- 15 graduates were named Newberry County School District Honor Graduates
- 5 graduates earned the South Carolina Academic Honors Award
- 22 graduates were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society
- Graduates earned a total of 612 dual credit hours for transfer credit towards college degrees
- 9 Palmetto Fellows recipients earned a potential scholarship total of \$262,800 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree
- 42 students earned a 3.0 or better and ranked in the top 30% of their class with a potential LIFE scholarship total of \$840,000 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree
- 71 students met the 3.0 requirement that qualifies a student for the HOPE scholarship with a potential HOPE scholarship total of \$795,200 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree

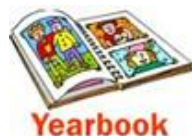
**SENIOR PICTURES**

**ENVIROTHON**

What do our South Carolina high school students know about Western Rangeland Management? Those that participated in the **22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Envirothon Competition** know a lot, and they proved it to panels of orals judges, station managers, staff, volunteers, and their peers, at the state competition held this past Friday at the Sandhill Research and Education Center in Columbia.



With temperatures in a range that might even mimic those out West, 18 teams of students from around the state came together to ride the environmental wild pony we call the Envirothon. Testing

student's knowledge of core environmental subjects such as Aquatics, Forestry, Soils, and Wildlife, the Envirothon also challenges students to work together and formulate a cohesive plan revolving around an oral presentation scenario based on the current topic: **Western Rangeland Management: Balancing Diverse Views**. Presenting arguments to back up their stance on what to do with 1,800 acres of bequeathed property to the state, students took natural, social, political and economic issues into consideration and defended their positions.

Although all the teams that participated were winners for their efforts in studying, preparing for, and completing the exams at the competition, 3 teams were awarded scholarships for their levels of expertise. Receiving \$1,000 in scholarships each was the **First Place Team of Spartanburg High School Team A**, following at a close second was **Spartanburg Day School** receiving \$500 each, and **Spartanburg High School's Team B** placed third overall with a \$250 scholarship for each team member. New teams, most improved teams, and teams that scored the highest at each test station were also recognized.

Spartanburg's Team A will now begin preparations for the bucking bronco; the **National Conservation Foundation's Envirothon**, North America's largest high school environmental education competition, which will be held in Pocatello, Idaho in July. The first place teams from each participating state and Canadian province will gather to be tested, in a similar, but more rigorous competition, with even higher stakes for scholarship awards. The SC Envirothon is coordinated by the SC Department of Natural Resources in cooperation with the SC Forestry Commission, USDA-Natural Resources Conservation Service, Central Carolina Technical College, Francis Marion University, Florence County Environmental Discovery Center, SC Soil and Water Society and Clemson University Sandhill Research and Education Center. 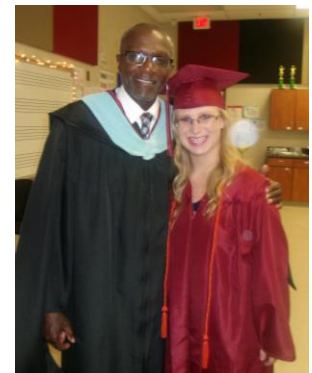

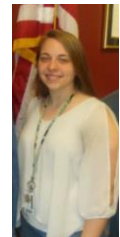
**SENIOR NIGHT**

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Environmental science students conducted research on how much insulation is needed to keep cold air in a house. They used cotton batten as the insulation and a plastic capped container filled

with ice and salt as their AC unit. They recorded the temperature of the inside of their house every minute for 30 minutes, graphed the data, then graphed the other groups' data to compare the results.

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Environmental Science students worked on projects to contribute to our very first "Earth Week" at MCHS. Our mission was to encourage the school to participate in our recycling efforts, and to have a more mindful approach to how we treat the environment. Students created videos, posters, pamphlets, artwork, and other products to educate their peers on why the Earth is important, and why we should

recycle our plastic. During lunch, we showed short environmental awareness video clips and had recycling games (such as bowling, bottle toss, and ring toss) set up around the cafeteria for everyone to come and play and learn more about recycling. Students won prizes for participating, along with a grade level prize to be announced May 18th based on which grade level collected the most plastic bottles!

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MCHS Crazy Hat Day took place on Tuesday, May 8, 2018. This is an annual fundraiser for our Relay for Life team. We pass the hats around to our faculty/staff and they are asked to collect at least \$10 before passing the hat to the next faculty/staff

member. We would like to thank everyone who participated. We raised over \$260. All proceeds collected will be donated to the American Cancer Society. It is so heartwarming to see our faculty, staff, and students come together and contribute a small part to help with the fight against cancer.



We would like to thank everyone who helped make the Newberry County Relay for Life event successful again this year for the Mid-Carolina High School Relay for Life Team. We had some really

outstanding and talented student volunteers that showed off their artistic abilities with preparation, set up, and face painting.

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This school year at Mid Carolina High School, we have taken our recycling to the next level. Our recycling program has always included paper and cardboard, and this year we have recycled over 5,000 pounds of it (equivalent to about 10 polar bears)! With the help and support of Newberry County and DHEC, we have been able to breathe new life into the recycling program at MCHS. We have put 2 blue recycling bins in every classroom, one labeled for

paper/cardboard, and the other to finally include plastic bottles and aluminum cans! Our school goes through a large amount of plastic bottles, as they are in vending

machines and served at breakfast/lunch. We placed large blue collection bins around the cafeteria and school, and Environmental Science students worked on various projects throughout the year to get the school more involved with recycling and caring for our planet in general. These projects included PSAs about the dangers of plastic and plastic pollution in our oceans, educating others about Earth Day and other environmental issues, as well as tackling problems we were facing with our new recycling efforts. This year we have recycled around 7,900 plastic bottles, enough to line up and run from MCHS to the paper plant a mile down the road!

Mid Carolina High School is working towards becoming certified as a South Carolina Green Steps School, which means we take annual sustainable steps towards being environmentally responsible. We are already doing many projects that qualify us, and this year we have formed a Green Steps Committee of student leaders to help us make our environmental dreams a reality. One of the biggest things we have done this year was holding our "Earth Week" event. All week during lunches we showed environmental awareness videos, hosted Earth Day Bingo, had a bottle collecting competition between grade levels, and even had recycling games made by students using recycled bottles and other materials set up for students to come play and win prizes. Students came and signed a pledge board for what they were going to do to help protect our planet, and students passed out "I pledge to be litter free" stickers. All of these amazing things have happened in just 1 school year, so I know with the amazing support of all our faculty, staff, students, and the community, we can grow our recycling program and Green Steps and truly help to make the planet a better (greener) place!

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MCHS students from all grade levels had the opportunity on Thursday, April 19, to meet one on one with Ms. Jennifer Moore from Piedmont Technical College, Newberry Campus to learn about Health and Medical careers. Students asked questions and signed up for career interest assessments to help them in choosing the next step in their education path.

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Mid-Carolina High School had several students attend field studies on Friday, April 27th, with the Newberry County Career Center.



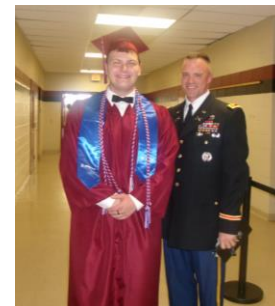
Biomedical Science students explored Bodies: The Exhibit in Atlanta, GA which helped students explore human body systems and understand their relation with each

## Advanced Diploma 2019

To receive an advanced diploma as the Class of 2019. You must complete 30 units of credit in your high school career. You must have all your Math and English credits and 4 credits of science. You must have Spanish 3H OR be completer at NCCC. See Ms. Smith in the Counseling office if you have any questions or need to change your schedule.

Please review the **test scores** required for the following awards and let Ms. Smith know ASAP if you have test **scores that meet the criteria for receiving these awards.**

## Newberry County Honor Graduate

The Newberry County Honor Graduate recognition is designed to honor seniors who have earned at least 30 units; maintained a 90 average for 4 years; earned a score of at **least 1180 on the SAT or 26 on the ACT**; and completed the full college preparatory program.

## South Carolina Academic Achievement Honors Award

For a student to receive a South Carolina Academic Achievement Honors Award, the student must meet the following criteria:

- complete twenty-four units of credit as described below\*
- receive a minimum grade of “B” for each semester course in grades 9–12 through the seventh semester; and achieve either a score of **710 or higher on the SAT verbal**, a score of **690 or higher on the SAT mathematics**, a score of **30 or higher on the ACT English**, or a score of **33 or higher on the ACT mathematics**;

OR

- each student shall have completed twenty-four units of high school credit;
- be eligible for graduation with a state high school diploma; and have a combined score of **1400 on the SAT verbal and math sections, or an ACT composite score of 31.**

Of the twenty-four units earned, eighteen units must be college preparatory coursework, four units in additional electives, and two units in one or more of the following: English, Science, Social Studies, or Mathematics.

\*College preparatory coursework includes the following:

- English (English I or above), four units
- Mathematics (Algebra I or above), four units
- Laboratory science, three units
- Social studies (United States/South Carolina studies, Economics/ Government and one unit of Global Studies/World History, Global Studies/ World Geography, or Western Civilization), three units
- Computer Science, one unit
- Physical Education, one unit
- Foreign Language, two units

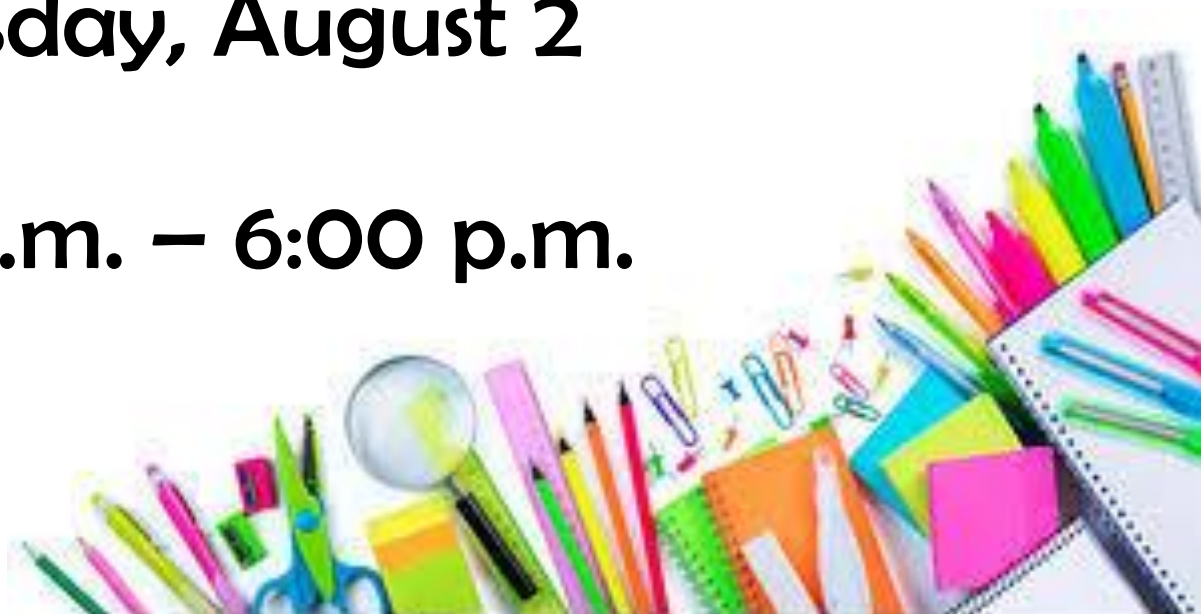

## **Required Proofs of Residency**

### **Mandatory For All**

Current tax notice or Lease Agreement (including physical address) or Mortgage Agreement (including physical address). If an individual is living with someone without a lease agreement, then a notarized written statement from the individual with whom they are living will be required (including physical address). **A post office box will not suffice for an address.** (In the case of parents that own additional property in the district the definition of Residency as defined by the Board of Trustees will apply).

### **Required**

*Any two of the following with the service address listed the same as the physical address:*

- Current power bill
- Current phone bill
- Current water bill
- Current Federal Tax Return
- Current cell phone bill
- Satellite TV/Cable bill
- South Carolina Drivers License

If an individual is unable to provide required proofs of residency, please contact Student Services at 803-321-1363.

### **\*Defining Residency**

Each student will attend the school that serves his/her place of legal residence as determined by the district's Board of Education. **The normal definition of a resident is one who occupies a dwelling within the area at issue, has a present intent to remain within that area for a period of time, and manifests the genuineness of that intent by establishing an ongoing physical presence within that area together with indicia that his presence is something other than merely transitory in nature – i.e., one's domicile.**
