All students are encouraged to apply. **All eVOL10 applicants must have taken a standardized exam such as ACT Explore, ACT Aspire, PSAT, or state standardized exam. All HITES12 applicants must have a minimum ACT math score of 25 (SAT math score: 590).** Our mission is to provide students who show an interest in engineering studies early exposure to and preparation for scientific study and research.

Why Should I Attend?

- Tour engineering labs and facilities
- Compete in engineering challenges
- Cultivate new friendships

Thirty-two students will be selected to participate in each program. Hands-on activities will spark an interest in the world of engineering and allow students to explore career opportunities.
