The **Lion Paw Award** for Evaline School for the 2019-2020 school year goes to third grade student **Abigail Spain**. Abigail has consistently demonstrated the qualities we look for in the Lion Paw award throughout this school year, both while school was open, and also when it was closed and distance learning was occurring.



Be Safe- Always walks when inside, helps to clean the classroom floor to keep it safe for everyone.

Be Responsible- Always on task and doing exactly what she needs to be doing when she is supposed to be doing it. Self regulates time and work. Can anticipate what needs to be done next and will do it without being asked.

Be Respectful- Respectful to everyone, staff and students alike. Always stepping up to help other students especially with reading to 2nd graders who struggle with reading, never casting judgement and encouraging them to try and to do their best.

Be a Positive Learner- Not once has she ever complained about an assignment given or given up when something got too hard. She will persevere through any learning and not just to complete an assignment, but to really understand and master a concept. This did not change with the transition to distance learning.

Examples of Additional Character Traits- Abigail demonstrated growth this year in the character traits of Generosity and Patience with welcoming, helping, and including students from other classes and those with differences from herself in activities she was doing.

Pandemic EBT (P-EBT): Emergency School Meals Program.

Dear Families,
Because COVID-19 closed our schools, your children may be eligible for food assistance, called Pandemic EBT (P-EBT): Emergency School Meals Program.

P-EBT provides families with funds to make up for the cost of meals while school was closed. This benefit is for Washington children in grades k-12 who receive free or reduced-price school meals. These benefits will be on an Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT) card which is used like a debit card to buy groceries.

If your family has lost income since schools closed, you may be eligible for free or reduced-price school meals. You can find out if you are eligible and how to apply by calling 360-785-3460 or emailing cbradshaw@evalinesd.k2.wa.us.

Every eligible child may receive **up to a maximum of \$399** of P-EBT. Immigration status does not matter for P-EBT – it is not Basic Food and will not count in a public charge test. P-EBT is intended to replace meals missed while schools closed due to COVID-19.

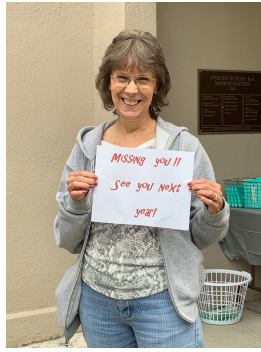
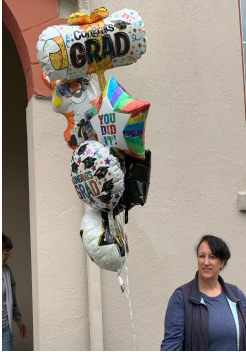
Children are allowed to get free meals from school and community sites and get P-EBT at the same time – they are separate programs. If your family does not receive Basic Food, you must apply for P-EBT if you want to receive the funds. The application will be open by June 30. There are two ways to apply:
