GED Preparation

The GED test offers people who did not complete high school the opportunity to earn high school credentials. If an individual's scores on the GED tests are satisfactory, an official High School Equivalency Diploma will be awarded by the State of Alabama. This credential is considered equivalent to a high school diploma and is recognized as such by employers, the military, and colleges. Our classes meet twelve months a year. They do not have beginning and ending dates, so students may start at any time. Under the supervision of an instructor, each student works independently on individualized plans of instruction, making progress at his/her own rate. Classes and books are free! For those students who qualify, financial assistance is available for practice tests and the GED tests. Students that successfully earn the GED through Jefferson State are eligible to take one free college credit course.
