



Dress Code

Good appearance, good attitudes, and good grooming add to the effectiveness of a student in school and are very conducive to a good learning environment. Students are expected to attend school in neat, clean, appropriate clothing and their bodies covered. The following rules are intended to define appropriate student attire and personal grooming. Parents are expected to enforce the dress code standards before the children leave for school each morning. This will allow the school to fully concentrate on the educational development of every child in the district.

If a student is unsuitably dressed, or his/her appearance is disruptive or distracting in nature, he/she will be able to call home and have appropriate clothing brought to him/her. If he/she are unable to reach an adult for alternate clothing, he/she will have to wear P.E. clothes. In areas not covered by the dress code, the onsite administrator shall make judgments at their own discretion.

- No torn clothing that exposes skin above the knee.
- No above the knee see through leggings.
- No sagging pants/shorts.
- No un-hemmed or cut off garments such as shorts or skirts.
- No mid-sections showing or exposed when arms are raised.
- No spaghetti straps or muscle t-shirts.
- No undergarments showing.
- No pajamas.
- No vulgar, racial, or inappropriate graphics on garments.
- No low cut dresses or blouses.
- No flip flops/slippers/backless shoes or Heelys.
- No pierced body parts other than ears.
- No studs, spikes, or stud accessories.
- No hats, bandanas, or sunglasses inside the building.
- No writing on bodies or clothes.
- Shorts, Skirts, and Dresses may not be shorter than mid-thigh.
