A Message from Mr. Moore
January is here!! Our second academic semester is on it's way and we are very excited to be back in session! In December the Nevada Department of Education issued our school rating based on 5 dif- ferent performance indicators:
• Academic Achievement - Academic Achievement is a measure of student performance based on a single administration of the State assessment.
• Student Growth - Student growth is a measure of performance on the State assessments over time.
• English Language - English Language Proficiency is a measure of English Learners achieving English Language proficiency on the State English Language Proficiency assessment, WIDA.
• Closing Opportunity Gaps - Closing Opportunity Gaps is a meas- ure of non-proficiency which includes students who were non- proficient on the previous year's State assessment and deter- mines if those students in the current assessment succeeded in meeting their Adequate Growth Percentile.
• Student Engagement - The Climate Survey is a state survey ad- ministered to students in a certain grade across the state.
The entire staff at Hafen are thrilled to report that we received a 3 out of 5 star rating this year! Prior to this year, our school was identified as a 1 out of 5 star rated. The ratings are based off of 2016-2017 data. We have our sights set on 5 stars for next year and we know that our students are capable of achieving that! We are going to continue to work as hard as possible to make it a reality! Help Us Keep Hafen Healthy!!!

We are now entering into the cold and flu season. It is imperative that we have the cooperation of our parents in helping stop the spread of the cold and flu virus. You

should keep your child at home if he/she might spread a contagious disease to other children or if your student is too sick to get through the school day. Children who are sick have a hard time learning and may infect other children and staff.

Here are some guidelines to help you decide when your child should stay home from school.

FEVER: Children with a fever of 100 or higher, should stay home until there is no fever for 24 hours <u>without</u> <u>the use of medication</u>. If you treat a fever with medicine before school, the fever can return and your child may still be contagious. If our student is sent home from school with a fever, please keep them home the following day. <u>MUST BE FEVER FREE FOR 24 HOURS</u>. Call your doctor if your child has a fever with pain, rash, weakness, vomiting or diarrhea.

DIARRHEA & VOMITING: One event of watery diarrhea or more than one event of vomiting is reason to keep your child home. If vomiting or diarrhea continues or your child also has a fever, rash or weakness, call our doctor. AGAIN, IF YOUR CHILD IS SENT HOME WITH VOMITING OR DIARRHEA, PLEASE KEEP THEM HOME THE FOLLOWING DAY.

PERSISTENT COUGHING: If your child's cough is worse than you would expect with a cold keep him at home. If they are having a hard time breathing or has a fever, call your doctor.

SORE THROAT: If your child's cough is worse than you would expect with a cold, keep him at home. If they are having a hard time breathing or has a fever, call your doctor.

STOMACH ACHE: If your child complains of a stomach ache, especially if he says it hurts to move and he does not want to eat, he should stay home. Call your doctor.
