

## Math Fact Time

There is a 10-minute math fact time built into our day. Each day students spend 10 minutes practicing math facts. The middle school focuses on multiplication facts and moves on to division facts. We are using the Mad Minute program to encourage automaticity and growth in knowledge of math facts. Students receive tickets for growth and for completing their page of 30, 40, or 50 facts in under a minute. The students will be able to use those tickets for a school auction at the end of each semester!




## Math Game of the Month

Salute

You need three players to play. Remove the face cards from a regular deck of cards (ace represents one). Deal out the cards evenly to two players who sit facing each other; each holds the stack of cards face down. The third player sits where he or she can see the other two players. When the third player says "Salute," the two players with cards simultaneously take the top cards off their respective piles and hold them on their foreheads with the face of the card outwards so that they can only see the other person's card. The third player announces the product (multiplication) of the two cards. Each of the two players holding a card tries to be the first to announce the number on his own card. The winner takes both cards. Rotate players so everyone gets a chance to be the one who says, "salute," and gives the product. **If your family plays this game at least once during the month of December, please fill out the ticket below and have your child return to school for an extra 20 math fact tickets to use for the school auction.**
