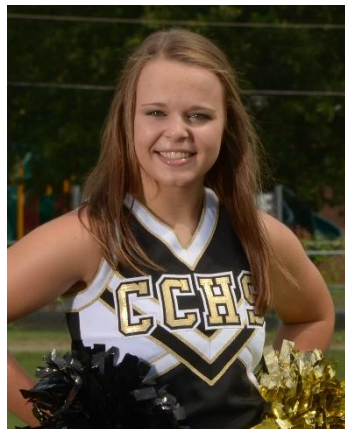


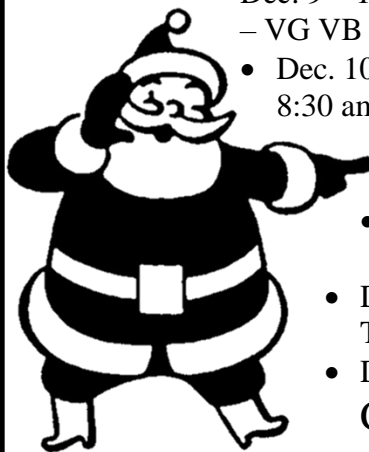


STUDENT OF THE MONTH
