The ACT at WHS: Why?

“ACT Explore, ACT Plan, and the ACT measure students' progressive development of knowledge and skills in the same academic areas from grades 8 through 12. Therefore, the scores from these three programs can help educators monitor students' academic growth over time.”

ACT Explore— 8th Grade

—Helps students begin preparing early for college and career

—Designed to help 8th and 9th students explore a broad range of options for their future

—Prepares students for high school coursework as well as post-high school choices

ACT Plan— 10th Grade

—Helps build a solid foundation for future academic and career success

—Provides information needed to address the school district's high-priority issues

—As a guidance resource, it helps students measure current academic development, explore career/training options, and make plans for the remaining years of high school and beyond.

The ACT Exam

The ACT is an educational and career planning tool and an assessment used to help determine a student's readiness for college. Beginning in Spring of 2014, all 11th grade students in Alabama will take the ACT at least once. Most colleges and universities require an ACT score for admission and to determine scholarship eligibility.

WHY TAKE THE ACT EXAM?

The ACT is an educational and career planning tool that helps assess academic readiness for college. Students are encouraged to perform to their best ability. ACT scores reflect what students have learned throughout high school and ACT scores provide colleges and universities with information used for recruiting, advising, and placement in courses. The State of Alabama currently administers ACT Explore to 8th graders and ACT Plan to 10th graders. Beginning during the 2013-2014 school year, all 11th grade students in the State of Alabama will take the ACT exam at least once, though students are encouraged to take the ACT more than once.

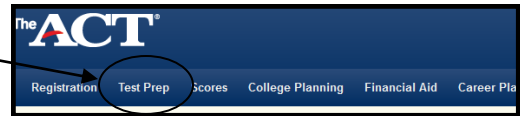

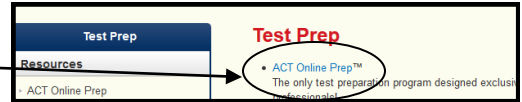

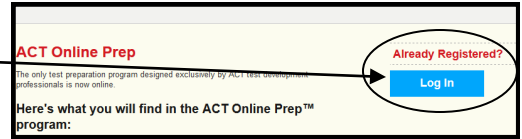
Step 1: Go to www.actstudent.org and click **Test Prep**.

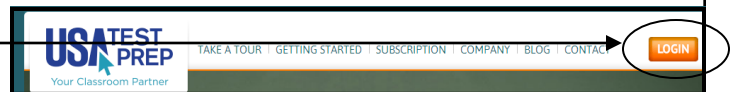

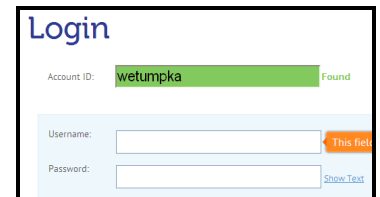

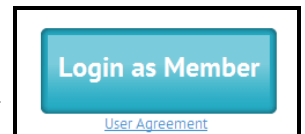
