Rezoning

As you likely heard from our superintendent, Dr. Kathy Murphy, on Monday night, HCS is waiting for a decision from federal court regarding our pending and preliminarily approved rezoning plan. As you may recall, our rezoning plan was preliminarily approved last year, but remains before the judge and under her review. On Monday night Dr. Murphy shared with the Hoover Board of Education that she does not believe we do not have adequate time to rezone our school district for 2017-2018. As a result, should the federal judge rule on our rezoning plan, her request to the court will be to implement the rezoning plan in 2018-2019.

- That sets BGIS up as a 5th/6th grade school again next year 2017-18
- All BGIS passing 5th graders, unless they move or have moved, will remain zoned for BGIS for 6th grade in 2017-18
- All BGIS passing 6th graders, unless they move or have moved, will remain zoned for R.F. Bumpus Middle School for 7th grade in 2017-18
- All SSC/DVES/TC passing 4th graders, unless they move or have moved, will remain zoned for BGIS for 5th grade in 2017-18

There is no doubt that all of our school families as well as staff have experienced stress created by this rezoning process. There are so many "unknowns" and much potential for unintended consequences. Now adding to these factors there will be more delay. I wish there was a way to offset this stress, but we pledge to make this transition and process as smooth as possible. For us at BGIS we will conduct a similar transition as in typical years. We will work with our feeder schools to transition students to, within and leaving BGIS in a way to set all up for a successful 2017-18 school year.

Transition 5th - 6th

Transition 6th - 7th

Transition Night at Bumpus - Bumpus Middle will host a transition night for all BGIS 6th grade students and their parents on the evening of Tuesday, May 2nd at 6PM.
Course Selection - Course Selection Sheets will go home with BG 6th graders on May 1st. Students will get these and an explanation from their homeroom teachers that day and then students will have the chance to look over these forms with parents before they are due back. They will be returned to their homeroom teacher and we will get them back to Bumpus as a group.



Encourage your child to do their best and get a good night's rest with a healthy breakfast each morning.







SAY IT:

Humility is putting others first by giving up what you think you deserve.

KNOW IT:

Dress Code for 5th & 6th Graders

Our teachers have reviewed the Code of Conduct in 1st period with all classes, but we are still seeing some issues with student dress code. Please review the dress code with your child again especially with the length of shorts. Some of our girls are wearing clothing that are too short. The range in the size of the girls is broad, so what's looks okay for one is not okay for the other. We try to be consistent with all our students.

Please remind your child of the length of shorts/dresses, which is number 5 in the Hoover Code of Conduct on page 29.

Please make note of the following...

2. Clothing should not reveal the body in an inappropriate manner. Examples: clothing which is too tight, too short, bare at the midriff, bare at the sides, sun dresses, "spaghetti strap" type tops, off-the-shoulder tops, tank tops, Racer-Back tops, low-cut front or back tops, sheer or see-through clothing, clothing worn backward or inside-out, pants worn too low (low riders), too long, or excessively large, etc. **Legging/Jeggings are not considered pants**. Undergarments should not be visible.

3. Excessively large clothing is not allowed.

4. Pants with holes above the knee are not appropriate.

5. Shorts must be hemmed and not shorter than mid-thigh when student is seated. The following types of shorts are not allowed: shorts that are torn or in disrepair, sweatshirt material, tennis shorts, spandex shorts. O High school students may wear athletic shorts.

• Shorts Rule may be adjusted at the Elementary Level.

6. Length of dresses, skirts, etc., is required to be at the top of the knee front and back when standing or walking.

• Length of dresses, skirts, etc. may be adjusted at the Elementary Level.





We believe nothing hinders student success more than absences, tardies, and checkouts.

When a student returns, the parent MUST provide in writing <u>within</u> <u>three (3) days of the return</u> an excuse that includes the following:

- **1. A written statement from the parent or doctor stating the reason for the absence.**
- 2. The date of the absence.
- **3. Parent signature**

Pre-arranged absence forms can be found on the school website

If a student has <u>more than 5 unexcused absences during the school</u> <u>year</u> (not semester), the student may be referred to the District Office of Attendance or Early Warning Court.

Community service occurs whenever a student voluntarily does an act of kindness or good deed for another. To pursue the Community Service Award, a student must see their grade level counselor for a community service application or print off the application on the next page of the newsletter. Once the application is complete and service activities are approved, the student may begin documenting community service hours on a community service card. A student must complete 30 hours of service within one year to receive the Community Service Award. Examples of qualifying deeds include volunteer work in: tutoring, hospital programs, church, youth groups, and scouting service projects.
