BGIS Parents,

We see the importance of attendance in school and the negative impact that chronic absenteeism has on learning, and need your help to spread the word! To combat the problem of chronic absenteeism, the Alabama State Department of Education is once again, showcasing the need to be at school every day with Attendance Awareness month this September.

At BGIS we are participating by holding a Team Attendance Campaign to focus a little friendly competition encouraging each team to strive to have the best student attendance percentage in their grade. We ask that you participate by encouraging your student to be on time, at school, every day and talking to them about the importance of showing perseverance by being at school each day. By promoting "Alabama Attendance Awareness Month" students and parents can become more aware of the crucial need for students in school when the bell rings.

Excused and unexcused absences quickly add up to too much time lost in the class-room, starting in kindergarten and even pre-k, especially for the most vulnerable populations. Students are at risk academically if they miss 10 percent of the school year, or about 18 days. Once too many absences occur, they can affect learning, regardless of whether absences are excused or unexcused. Our district policy calls for the consideration of retention of any student missing more than 9 days from school. Chronic Absence is a problem we can solve when the whole community works together.

As a reminder absence excuse notes must be submitted to the front office within 3 days of an absence. We have a box in the lobby and a basket at the front desk. Students are responsible for submitting these notes, but as a parent of a pre-teen I advise you to follow up. Use iNowHome Portal to check on any absence not switched to excused within a couple of days. Call the front office and ask for our attendance secretary, Mrs. Ashley Kilgore, and she will be more than happy to assist. If a student needs to be out for a trip or upcoming event parents can request a pre-arranged excused absence by submitting a letter of educational value along with the district form.

Thank you for recognizing that attendance at school is vitally important if students are to be successful in their studies. If your child must be absent for a reason other than those listed as approved by the Hoover City Schools Code of Conduct and Elementary Handbook, you may request that the days missed be coded as excused. Please be aware of the following important information:

- Approval of your request is not guaranteed.
- Days requested cannot be excused if they will occur during state/district testing days or if the allowable number of absences for the semester has already been accumulated or will be accumulated due to the requested absence.
- Principals may advise against your child missing school due to low grades or prior attendance record.
- Parents and students are responsible for all missed work, and the teacher has the authority to determine deadlines for missed work being submitted.
- A <u>completed</u> Anticipated Absence Form MUST be submitted to the school office at least three (3) days in advance of the absence. This form is to be used for full day absences only.

Help Your Child Succeed in School: **Build the Habit of Good Attendance Early**

School success goes hand in hand with good attendance!

DID YOU KNOW?


- · Starting in kindergarten, too many absences can cause children to fall behind in school.
- Missing 10 percent (or about 18 days) can make it harder to learn to read.
- Students can still fall behind if they miss just a day or two days every few weeks.
- Being late to school may lead to poor attendance.
- Absences can affect the whole classroom if the teacher has to slow down learning to help children catch up.

Attending school regularly helps children feel better about school—and themselves. Start building this habit in preschool so they learn right away that going to school on time, every day is important. Good attendance will help children do well in high school, college, and at work.

WHAT YOU CAN DO

- Set a regular bed time and morning routine.
- · Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before.
- Find out what day school starts and make sure your child has the required shots.
- Introduce your child to her teachers and classmates before school starts to help her transition.
- Don't let your child stay home unless she is truly sick. Keep in mind complaints of a stomach ache or headache can be a sign of anxiety and not a reason to stay home.
- If your child seems anxious about going to school, talk to teachers, school counselors, or other parents for advice on how to make her feel comfortable and excited about learning.
- Develop back-up plans for getting to school if something comes up. Call on a family member, a neighbor, or another parent.
- Avoid medical appointments and extended trips when school is in session.

¿SABÍA QUE...?

- Empezando en el kínder, muchas ausencias pueden causar que los niños se atrasen en la escuela.
- Faltar el 10% (más o menos faltar 18 días en el kínder) puede bajar el rendimiento en el primer grado y hacer que cueste más aprender a leer.
- Los estudiantes se pueden seguir atrasando aunque sólo falten uno o dos días durante varias semanas.
- Las llegadas tarde en los primeros grados pueden predecir que el estudiante tendrá mala asistencia en los años siguientes.
- La falta de asistencia a la escuela puede afectar a todos en la clase, ya que el maestro tiene que disminuir el aprendizaje para ayudar a los niños a ponerse al día.
- Las escuelas pueden perder dinero para programas educacionales porque frecuentemente la asistencia es la base para la asignación de los fondos.

Asistir regularmente a la escuela, ayuda a los niños a sentirse mejor en la escuela—y consigo mismos. Empezar a crear este hábito en la edad preescolar, los hará aprender rápidamente la importancia de ir a la escuela a la hora indicada y todos los días. La buena asistencia ayudará a los niños a tener éxito en la preparatoria, la universidad y en el trabajo.

COMO AYUDAR A SU HIJO


- Establezca una hora consistente para acostarse y la rutina de cada mañana.
- · Prepare la ropa y las mochilas la noche anterior.
- Averigüe el día en que empieza la escuela y asegúrese que su hijo tenga las vacunas requeridas.
- Presente a su hijo a sus maestros y compañeros de clase antes que la escuela empiece, para ayudarle con la transición a la escuela.
- Sólo deje que su niño se quede en casa si está realmente enfermo. Tenga en mente que las quejas de un dolor de estómago o de cabeza pueden ser seña de ansiedad y no una razón para quedarse en casa.
- Si su hijo parece ansioso por ir a la escuela, hable con los maestros, consejeros u otros padres para que le aconsejen sobre cómo hacerlo sentir cómodo y motivado a asistir a la escuela.
- Prepare opciones para llegar a la escuela si algo inesperado sucede.
 Contacte con anterioridad un familiar, un vecino u otro padre para que le ayude en esos días.
- Evite citas médicas y viajes prolongados durante el tiempo de escuela.
- Contacte al personal de la escuela u oficiales de la comunidad para encontrar ayuda sobre transportación, vivienda, empleo o problemas de salud.

Fifth and sixth grade students can submit their membership application by returning it to your classroom teacher by September 29.



SAY IT:

Friendship is using your words and actions to show others you care.

KNOW IT:

Ask a kid:

- What are some things that your best friend does to make you feel special?
- Who are some grownups you know that are good friends?

Ask a grown up:

- Has there ever been a time where a friend let you down? Explain.
- Share a story of a time you were a good friend to someone who was in a difficult situation.

SEE IT:

Discuss the movie Toy Story as a family (the theme song

"You've Got a Friend in Me" says it all). Specifically talk about how Woody and Buzz look past their differences and make an effort to say or do something nice to show that they care.

BE IT:

A couple nights each school week, ask your child(ren) how he/she was a good friend to someone at school that day. Examples might be:

- Making an effort to welcome a new student and show them around the school
- Defending a classmate when they are being treated unfairly
- Letting an adult know when a student needs help and is in trouble
- Sharing a snack with someone who didn't bring anything.



- 1 in 300 children will be diagnosed with cancer by age 21




