GAME DAY INFORMATION - HOOVER VS. THOMPSON

Hoover High BUCS Football will host Thompson High this friday night at The Met. Game time is 7 pm. We are expecting a crowd of 10,000 - 15,000 for the regional championship game. Please try to attend the game if possible. After meetings with city officials, Hoover Police, and others, there are a few logistics you need to be aware of.

- 1. Plan ahead for travel delays on Stadium Trace Parkway and other roadways starting around 4-5 pm.
- 2. Parking lots will open at 4:30 pm. All lots will be used. Bumpus will be used as an overflow lot with shuttles available. .
- 3. Gates will open a 5 pm.
- 4. All tailgating must be be on grassy areas. Tents, cookers, chair etc. must not block parking spaces.
- 5. If dropping off children, do not drop them off on Stadium Trace Parkway! Hoover Police will be enforcing this directive. Please use the far right lane of Stadium Trace to enter the drop off area. Follow signage. You will be directed to circle around the far lots to the front of The Met for drop off. Multiple children were almost hit on the roadway at our last home game, so please be careful.
- 6. Presale tickets are \$7.00 and are on sale at the following locations:

<u>HOOVER BELLE APPLICATIONS</u> - Hoover Belles are accepting applications for 2018!!! Current Sophomore girls who are interested may apply online at www.hooveral.org; NOW THRU November 16 2017. The Hoover Belles were established as a community service organization in 1980 and are governed by the Hoover Belle Committee. Young ladies are eligible to apply to become a Hoover Belle during their sophomore year in high school and serve a two-year term.

A HOOVER BELLE MUST BE A RESIDENT OF THE CITY OF HOOVER, of exemplary character, have a pleasant personality, be continuously enrolled in school, and enjoy the civic responsibility of serving her city and local charities. She must maintain a minimum GPA of 2.5 for her full term as a Hoover Belle.

During her term of service, each Belle is required to work a minimum of 30 hours of community service through the Hoover Belle program. A Belle must conduct herself in a manner that will bring honor to the Hoover Belle program and will be required to sign the Hoover Belle Pledge vowing to be drug, alcohol, and tobacco free during her tenure as a Hoover Belle.

SCHOOL INFORMATION

STUDENT DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Student Drop Off and Pick Up is <u>located in the front of the school</u>. No other locations are allowed on campus or in nearby neighborhoods. Students being dropped off/picked up in ocations that are not permissible will be assigned discipline.

Attendance Reminders:

<u>Check In/Out Policy:</u> Students must be checked in/out at the main campus, not at Hoover Hall. There are two ways to check out a student:

- 1. Arrange the check out ahead of time. (This can be done earlier, the same day or weeks/months in advance and MUST be done in at the school by a person on their contact list.)
- 2. Walk up to check out at the bell change. (Students may meet you at the check-out desk, but cannot wait for you if you are not physically in the lobby.)
- *Students MAY NOT be checked out with a note, email, fax or phone call.

Students MAY check themselves IN with a parent note or a doctor note. Otherwise they have to have a parent's signature. Any check in without a note or parent signature is automatically unexcused.

CHROMEBOOKS

Repairs- If your device is currently in need of repair, please take it to your school to turn in for repair. Students can plan to receive their device back within the first few days of school. You can submit a repair request viawww.hcseli.com by selecting the service requests tab at the top right hand corner and clicking on repair request.

New students- All students grades 3-12 who have completed on line registration, agreed to a device, and do not owe fees for technology will automatically be sent a device. No request needed. The school will distribute the devices on their schedule.

Charger Request- If your student needs a new charger, please fill out a request form via our website <u>www.hcseli.com</u> by selecting the service requests tab at the top right hand corner and clicking charger request. There is a \$40 charge for all chargers and it is not included in the protection plan.

<u>POLICY FOR MYSCHOOLFEES TRANSACTIONS</u> - Hoover City Schools Policy for myschoolfees.com transactions are still pending until payment has been posted by Hoover City Schools. If the transaction returns, a \$25 assessment fee will be applied. Items returned for any reason, including account/routing number issues or insufficient funds, are considered and treated as returned checks.
