### Argument Writing

#### **STEP ONE – 11/8-9, due 11/13**

**Prompt**: Which of Janie's husbands fosters her growth the most?

**Writing Assignment**: Select one of the following statements to argue in favor of. Write a full argument, including an introductory statement, a claim, two pieces of contextual evidence, and a conclusive sentence.

- Janie's most significant growth happens when she leaves Logan Killicks. Support your stance with information from the text as well as from class discussions.
- Without Joe Starks, Janie would have never found her voice. Support your stance with information from the text as well as from class discussions.
- Tea Cake is an ideal mate for Janie because he helps her achieve freedom. Support your stance with information from the text as well as from class discussions.
- Janie does not truly find her voice and independence until she is alone. Support your stance with information from the text as well as from class discussions.

#### STEP TWO - 11/13 in class

**Silent Discussion Assignment**: Each of the claims regarding Janie's most significant growth are hung up in the room. Consider these other arguments and offer one rebuttal for each.

- Write your rebuttal on the butcher paper (do not talk). You will do this on three of the claims.
  - Your rebuttal can be a quote or a scene from the text that supports your argument.
  - Once everyone is finished, go to the claim that represents your argument. Write down the rebuttal that best challenges your argument.

#### STEP THREE – 11/13 homework

**Writing Assignment**: Using the quote or scene you discovered in class today, write a paragraph that addresses the counter to your argument, including an introductory statement, a counter claim, one piece of contextual evidence, and a conclusive sentence.

- A counter claim may look like this:
  - o The example is true, but...
    - State the example and then provide reason(s) it is not relevant to your argument.
  - The example is true but not as significant as...
    - Acknowledge that the example is true but not as important as your argument.
  - o The example is flawed because...
    - Point out the invalidity of the opposing argument.
