About the education/training required for this career:

- Once you know the education that is required for your chosen career, select a college or university that you are interested in attending for the next stage of your assignment. Be sure the school offers majors in your field. Answer the following questions:
- What are the entrance requirements (GPA, ACT/SAT score, etc)?
 - What is the average ACT score among entering Freshmen?
- What requirements do you have to fulfill during the application process?
- What are the estimated expenses for you based on your in/out of state status?

About what you can do now to prepare yourself for your selected field:

• What kind of volunteer or job experience can you do now that will prepare you for the skills and traits that you will need in the future?

Project Requirements

- Creatively **display** your findings. You may use a tri-fold board or create a powerpoint.
- Imagine that you are applying for a job that will get your foot in the door of your selected field (runner at a law firm, kennel assistant, camp counselor, etc.), and write a **cover letter and résumé.**
- Give a **speech** to your classmates that details your education and career path.

- Feb. 21-24 Display/Cover Letter and Résumé/Speech due
 - You will sign up for a presentation date. DO NOT sign up for a date that you know you will miss!
 - o All of your materials will be due at the time of your speech.
 - Cover Letter and Résumé will not be part of the display. Submit separately—typed and stapled.
 - O You must have the rubric with you at the time of your presentation.
