## Walt Whitman's "Song of Myself" Numbers 10 & 33

1) "Song of Myself" celebrates heroism. As you read, jot down who Whitman recognized as heroes in the two parts?

In "Song of Myself" #10, Whitman uses <u>omniscient first-person</u>, meaning that the speaker is able to <u>enter each person's consciousness</u>, but he still <u>uses first-person</u> "I".

2) Why is Whitman's **free verse**, found in #10, considered **different** than Shakespearean poetry?

In Song of Myself #33, Whitman uses anecdotes (brief stories to emphasize points) to engage the audience's emotions and intellect. He is able to subtly explore moral issues without sounding "preachy".
