Although banned by the Supreme Court, segregated buses were still a fact of life in the southern states during this period. 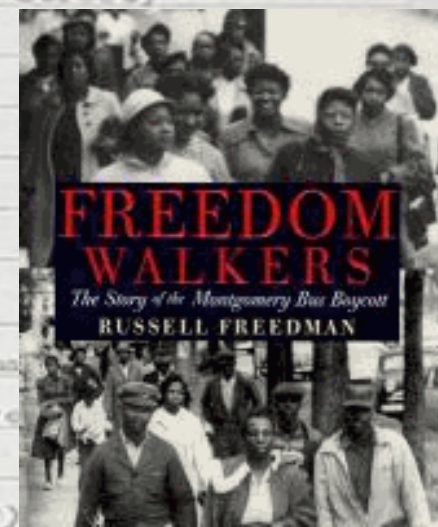
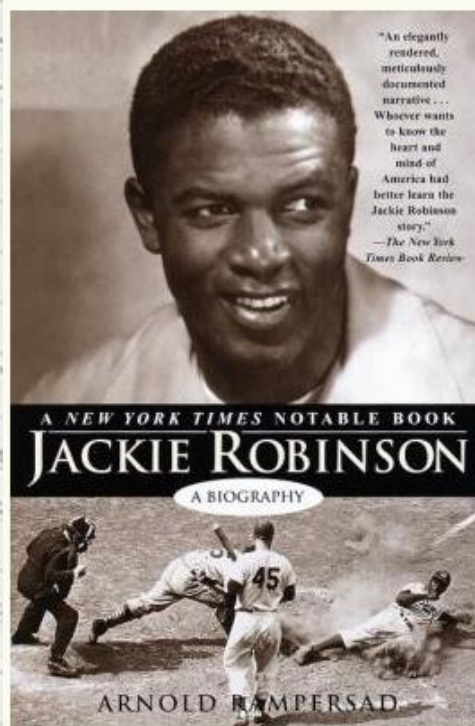
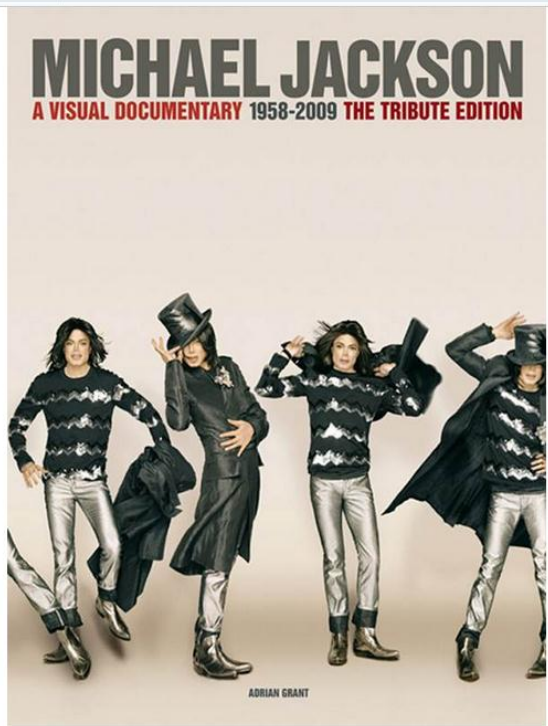
