

Parent Involvement Plan

Johnson Elementary will provide opportunities for parental involvement by offering a forum for collaboration with faculty, learning activities that will complement student's education, and provide updated information about Title One programs.

The following are the major components of the plan that includes a shared responsibility approach to help improve and maintain high student academic achievement.

Strategies that will be used to promote this plan:

1. A parent involvement night will take place at the beginning of the school year to inform parents about the purpose of Title One and the school's involvement in the program. During the meeting, the school will distribute and/or review:

- *The School-Parent Compact

- *Title One Budget Information/Planned Expenditures for the upcoming year.

- *Opportunities to communicate with administration and staff to improve the academic performance of their child.

2. Throughout the school year, several opportunities will be provided that encourages greater collaboration between parents and faculty. These will include:

- *A Parent Advisory Committee will meet once each semester to review any academic and/or Title One parent involvement concerns and questions.

- *In collaboration with PTO, Literacy and Math Parent nights will be scheduled to help promote greater parent involvement with AR reading programs and math skills.

- *A Technology/Mac Book Parent Night will be schedule to provide feedback on student use of Mac Books/iPads and to provide advice on student technology needs.

*Suggestions from teachers for activities/materials for parents to involve students at home in their educational development.

*Scheduled Parent/Teacher conferences during the first semester of the school year.

*Parents are offered an orientation/training session on the school's digital program for Mac Book laptops at the beginning of each school year. This meeting also fulfills the training requirement for parents before students receive laptops in 3rd – 5th grades.

*The school will provide reading, math, and multi-sensory intervention services for at risk students. These students will be identified by using various forms of data including Dibels, Performance Series, ACT Aspire, Moby Max, weekly classroom assessments, and LCS approved multi-sensory screeners.

3. As a school wide Title One school, a survey will be distributed at the end of the year to all parents. The feedback from this interment will allow the school to evaluate the Title One program. The survey results will be used to implement changes to improve the overall Title One program at Johnson Elementary.

This plan will be updated on an annual basis to reflect the ever-changing needs of the parents and school.
