Dear Parent(s)

Beginning Tuesday, September 6, 2016, your child's class will begin participating in the miDevice (Bring Your Own Device) program. The vision of Collier Elementary is to utilize technological devices to enhance "anywhere, anytime" student learning through the use of miDevice. Classroom uses include watching assigned videos, Office 365, Accelerated Reader, eBooks, collaborating with peers, educational apps, research, and more.

The following devices that can be used at Collier Elementary are devices with a 7-inch screen or larger as indicated below:

- iPad Mini, iPad: 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Mini, Air or future Generations
- Android devices with Android Version 2.2 or newer (Kindle, Nook, etc.)
- Laptops

The following devices that cannot be used at Collier Elementary are:

- Pandigital Novel
- iPhone, iPod, iPod Touch
- Nintendo DS, PSP, or other handheld gaming device

Students

The board supports access by students to rich information resources and the development by staff of appropriate skills to analyze and evaluate such resources.
