

Mobile County Training School will accommodate students and parents in order to support the school-parent-student partnership. Our building is handicap accessible for all parents and students with disabilities. 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On September 12th, 2016, we had our annual Title I meeting. We discussed the rights of parents, the meaning of Title I, how Title I funding is used, support student achievement, parent survey, and parent-teacher conferences.

Mobile County Training School appreciates the support of all parents and invite parents to participate in parent meetings such as: Annual Title I meetings and parent-teacher conferences during the school day and after school. In our parent meetings, we will communicate with the parents on a more personal level. This will include increased parental workshops. Parental involvement funds will be used to provide parent information in the parenting center, to purchase materials for parent use, money for parent communication and workshops for parents.

During parent meetings, Mobile County Training School provides Title I information about Title I programs, school curriculum and academic assessments used to analyze student performance and the 1% set aside for parental support. Parents will be able assess the curriculum, schedule parent meetings, and participate in decision making about their child's education. Parent Compacts are used for partnership conferences with the student, parent and teacher

Compacts are reviewed and revised each year by the Parent Advisory Committee and the ACIP Committee. Each parent is given a signed compact at the beginning of the academic school year. The compact should be reviewed during a parent teacher conference.

Parent feedback is valuable and appreciated. Parents who may not agree with the Continuous Improvement Plan (ACIP) may express their disapproval in writing to the Principal. It will be discussed in the next ACIP meeting with the committee.

Mobile County Training School will achieve this in the annual Title I meeting which is held in the fall of each academic school year. Parents will be presented with an overview of the content standards, student achievement standards, and high stake tests. The overview of Title I will be presented, service offered, and how parents can be involved.

The ACIP committee will ensure that parents will be trained and the material will align with the school's needs. The Parent Resource Center is located on the 6th grade hall in room A 104, parents are welcomed to visit. Parent meetings are held regularly throughout the year. Computers with internet are made accessible for parents to use in the Parent Resource
