



NORTH MOBILE COUNTY K-8 PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT PLAN



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1. During the first quarter, North Mobile K-8 holds its required annual parenting meeting. Parents are notified of the meeting through a written notice sent home with students, a school messenger message sent by the principal and the meeting date being posted on the school website.
2. Parent meetings will be offered at two different times - one during the day and one in the evening—to make it accessible to every parent. We also have a parent center located in the lobby for parents to pick up material and information. A computer is also available for parents to check INOW for student progress in the library from 7:30-2:30.
3. It is our desire to have parent input; therefore, a parent committee has been created that includes parents, the school counselor, the Title I facilitator, and an administrator to ensure successful implementation.
4. Title I funds are used to purchase materials and supplies for the parent center, copier needs for parent communication and stipends for teachers who provide parent training.

1. Communication with parents is offered in a timely fashion through meetings, monthly news letters, school messenger and postings on the website. Information shared pertains to EQT reading/math/language proficiency scores, common core standards, ACT Aspire scores and student progress. Parents also learn how to schedule parent/teacher conferences.
2. A parent-teacher conference is held with each parent to discuss the school-parent compact and how it relates to their child's achievement. Parent's will be asked to sign the compact and the homeroom teacher will explain it to their students. The compact is developed through input provided by the committee.
3. In May of each year, NMCK-8 brings in the ACIP committee to review, evaluate, and revise the Continuous Improvement Plan. There are two parents on the committee. Parents are notified through the school messenger that the plan is under review and are given an opportunity to offer feedback. Parents are also informed that after the plan is reviewed and finalized they may still voice their concerns in writing to the school and the school will submit their concerns to central office at the same time the ACIP is submitted.

1. NMCK-8 will provide in-service training for parents on academic skill sets used in the classroom such as STEM activities and Math workshops.
2. NMCK-8 will continue to work with the teachers and staff through in-services, faculty meetings, and grade-level meetings in understanding the importance of parental involvement and that parents are our partners.
3. NMCK-8 provides opportunities for the participation of parents with limited English proficiency and parents with disabilities.
4. NMCK-8 makes every effort to work with parents in meeting their requests as related to their involvement in their child's education. Parent surveys are conducted and used to help determine any new accommodations and plans concerning parental involvement.
