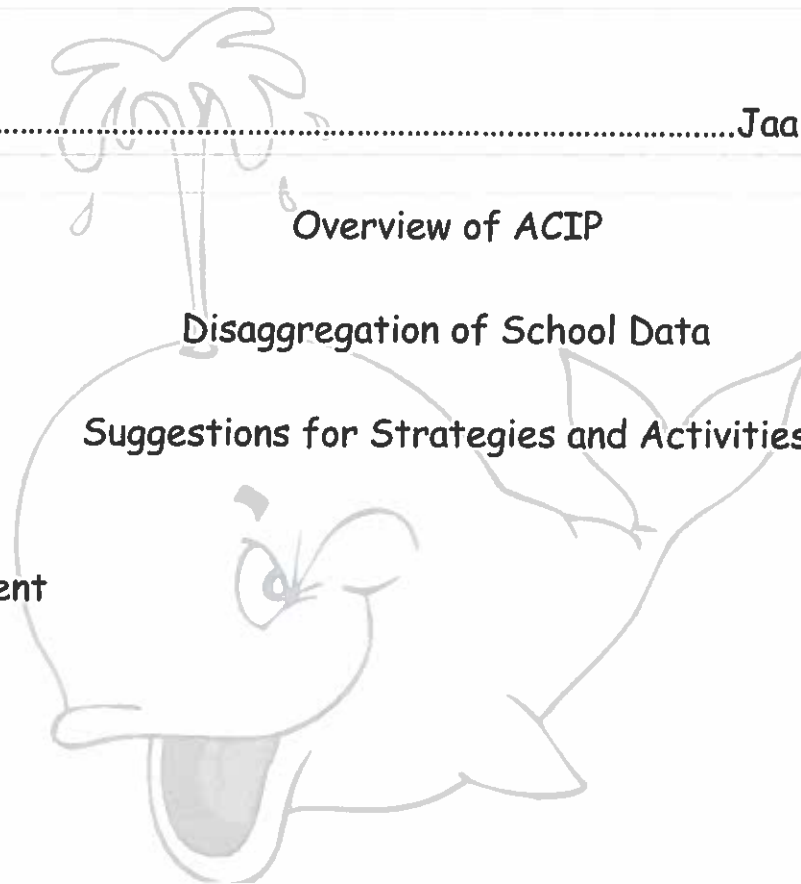

August 22, 2016

The meeting was opened by Ms. Holcombe.

The committee reviewed the ACT Aspire data for grades 3-5. It was noted that our scores decreased in Reading and Math for grades 3-5 from the 2015 scores. Our percent of students scoring in the % Ready dropped in every subject except Math, which increased by 5%. We discovered that Foundational Skills in Math was our greatest area of need and Key Ideas and Details showed our greatest area of need in Reading.

The committee reviewed the results from the ACIP Survey the faculty took in May 2016 to rate each ACIP activity as Effective or Not Effective and whether or not to keep the activity in the plan. The faculty was also given the opportunity on this survey to add their suggestions for additions or changes to the plan.

These results were discussed by the committee and considered for changes to the plan.

The committee opted to keep our objectives the same as last year since our test scores decreased a bit. Some activities were struck and some were changed to more accurately reflect what we wanted to see happen this school year.

The committee was in agreement with the decisions.

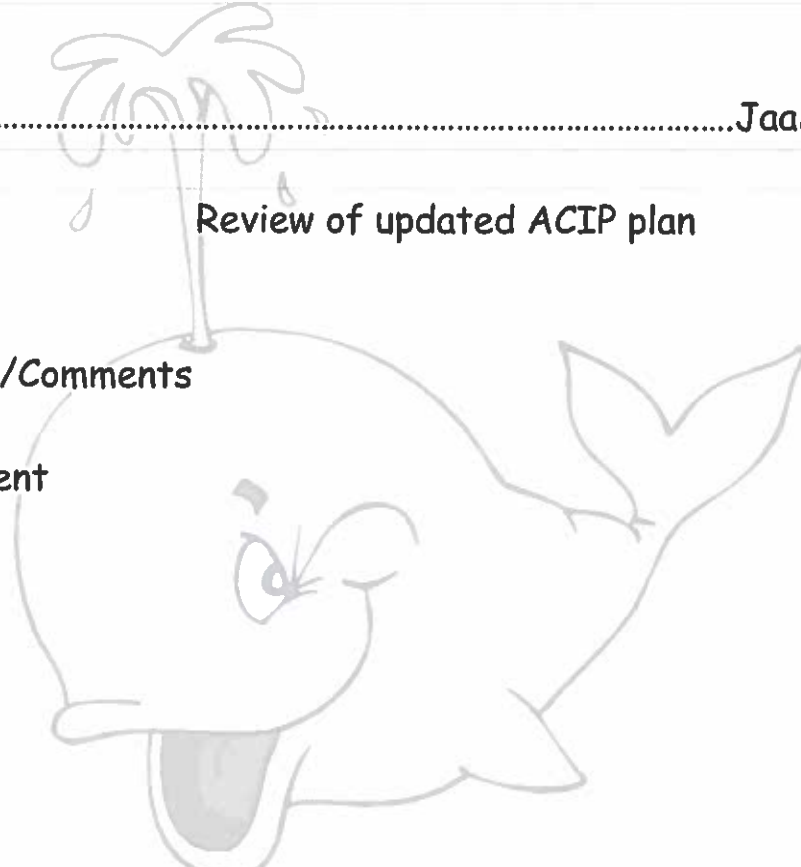



