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What is AR?

- AR stands for Accelerated Reader.
- It is a Renaissance program designed to help students achieve their greatest potential in reading.
- PreK and Kindergarten do not participate in AR.
- Students in 2nd-6th grades are given an AR grade at the end of every nine weeks. It is averaged into their reading grades. 1st grade does not start to get a grade until after Christmas.

AR parties & honors for 2nd-6th grade

- If students in 2nd-6th grade meet their AR goal each nine weeks, they will be rewarded with an AR party. 1st grade can attend these parties after January.
- The top 8 students in each grade will attend a special AR trip in the spring.
- The top 8 students will be determined by the highest number of points and maintaining 85% accuracy for each nine weeks.
- On Honor's Day, the top four students in each grade will be recognized.



What is **ZPD?**

- ZPD, the Zone of Proximal Development, indicates the reading range for a particular student. A student reading independently would benefit most from reading in the low to middle range of ZPD.
- You can receive information on your child's ZPD from your classroom teacher or librarian.


The percentage next to quizzes must be 85% or above for your child to meet their goal.

Your child needs to reach their point goal by the end of the nine weeks.



Looking for the Book level and AR Quiz number:

In this example, the book level (BL) is 1.5. If your child's ZPD range fits the 1.5 book level, they may take a test on this book when they return to school.

** If you find a book from Troy public library or find that some of your personal books are AR, PLEASE write down the AR quiz number. It makes it a lot easier for your child to find it on Renaissance.


Finding books within your child's Reading range:





Kindergarten and 1st grade- Checkout 1 library book at a time

2nd – 5th grade- Checkout 2 library books at a time.

6th grade- Checkout 3 library books at a time.



Library Book Care

Please go over the following guidelines with your child ©

- 1. Do not leave library books in the school hallway.
- 2. Do not let your friend at school read your library book. If they lose it, you are responsible for it.
- 3. Do not leave your library books in your car.
- 4. Keep your books inside.
- 5. Keep books away from Pets.
- 6. Do not write or draw in library book.
- 7. Protect your books from bad weather.
- 8. Do not put a library book on your bookshelf in your house.
- 9. Never lay a book face down or bend a page to keep your place. Book marks are available for free in GES library ©
- 10. Gently put your books in your backpack when you're not reading them.
