Star City Bulldog Baseball got off to a slow start because of all the rain, but the Bulldogs have won three conference games. The first was against Dumas 12-2 followed by Hamburg 10-5.

The Bulldogs have also played in the Ralph Gross Memorial Tournament and lost to the host team 1-0 in the championship game.

The Bulldogs also played Little Rock Central and lost 5-3.

Head Coach Scott Johnson stated, "We have played a very tough non conference schedule, but we feel this will prepare us for post season play."

On Wednesday April 1, 2015, the Bulldogs defeated Dewitt 16-1 in 3 innings improving their conference record to 3-1 in 8AAAA. Garry Hill and Cole Muckleroy pitched for the Bulldogs.

The Bulldogs lost to Pine Bluff High 8-4 on Monday at home. Blake Wynn pitched 5 innings, Austin Capps pitched 1 inning, and Cole Muckleroy pitched 1 inning. Austin Powell hit a 3 run home run in the 7th inning for the Dogs.

The Star City Lady Dog softball team has had four games so far as the start of their season. They met the Lady Billies of Monticello Monday, March 16 and were defeated 13-0 but defeated the Drew Central Lady Pirates the next day 17-4.

Jaela Martin was the game's starting pitcher giving up only four runs to the Lady Pirates.

On March 31, the Lady Dogs defeated Hamburg 9-7 at home. Hamburg grabbed the early lead with 3 runs at the top of the first inning; however, the Lady Dogs brought in 5 runs in the first inning to take the lead. They scored on an error, a steal of home by Jessica Beatty, a ground out by Stevie Matthews, and an RBI single by Jessica Allbright.

In the second inning, the Lady Dogs scored on an RBI by Beatty bringing home Jaela Martin. The game was tied in the fourth, but Star City has a strong sixth inning giving them the win. Jordan Grayson's sacrifice fly scored Harleigh Aldridge.

On April 1, the Lady Dogs fell to De-Witt 7-1 with the only Star City Score on an RBI by Jordan Grayson.


