

Jared Blake speaks to student body





Country sensation Jared Blake has not forgotten his roots. He returned to his Alma Mater to discuss his life and career with the student body, Wednesday, November 12.

Blake, who has a hit single on the charts playing on 80 radio stations and a music video, stated that his life has not always been easy. Blake has faced rehab for drug and alcohol addiction, and lost record contracts because of it. He wants students to know that the choices you make now can be costly ten years from now.

Blake was part of season one's The Voice and was on Blake Shelton's team. He spiraled downward from there only to bring himself back up. "I am at a place right now where I can afford to talk to schools and SCHS was at the top of my list. I feel like I am 10 years behind where I should be because of all this. I put drugs/alcohol above everything else in my life and not one good thing came out of it," he stated.

One good thing can come out of it: he can be an inspiration to young people who listen to his story.




