Jordan Frizzell was selected as the Outstanding Computer Science Teacher at the Project Lead The Way conference at Arkansas Tech March 11. Frizzell teaches a computer science class and is also the EAST instructor at the high school. He addressed the conference twice in the three day event about what a computer science class is and how they are taught at SCHS.

Star City School District is a pioneer in offering a computer science class. Next year all schools in the state will have to offer these classes as mandated by law.
