THE COMMUNITY

The City of Maricopa is a city in Pinal County located 20 miles South of Phoenix. As of the 2010 census, its population was estimated at 44,000. Residents of the city are primarily middle class families living in a suburban/rural setting. The City of Maricopa lies between two neighboring Native American communities; the Ak-Chin Indian Community and the Gila River Indian Community.

MARICOPA HIGH SCHOOL

Between the years of 2008 and 2013, Maricopa High School expanded and renovated the campus to include a media center, new gymnasium, additional classrooms and a Performing Arts Center (PAC) which accommodates 750 guests. The athletic facilities include; an outfield, turf football field, soccer field, two new baseball fields and softball fields with batting cages and a weight room.

Maricopa High School is a four year comprehensive high school located in the City of Maricopa, Arizona. Maricopa offers a variety of curriculum choices, which include Advanced Placement, Fine Arts as well as Career and Technical Education programs. The high school athletic programs are offered at the varsity, junior varsity and freshman levels throughout the school year. Extracurricular activities include numerous clubs, dances, competitions and performing arts events. The academic program is structured in two semesters and accommodates 6 credits each school year with the option of credit redemption in an online capacity. Classes are 58 minutes long, with 6 periods of actual classroom instruction during a regular school day.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

The Advanced Placement (AP) program is designed for high school students and offers them the opportunity at the high school level to take college-level courses taught by secondary teachers. College and university professors and high school teachers develop the course materials. Students are able to demonstrate the concepts and skills mastered through academic specific tests administered in May of each year. The tests are scored on a 1-5 scale, with the 5 being the highest numerical grade. Receiving high scores can result in college/university credit, advanced placement or both. Students may take the AP exams without prior enrollment in In the 2014-2015 school year students the courses. participated in the following AP exams: Biology, Calculus, Language, Literature, US History, US Government and Economics, Art Studio.


