### Math Department Hightlight

Our department highlight of the month is our Math Department, under the leadership of Mrs. Tawny Schultz. Below you will see highlights from each math teacher's class. They invite you to come into their classrooms and be a part of math exploration with their newly acquired Math Envision textbooks. They are excited and celebrating the growth they have already seen in our grade 6-8 students.

### For the month of October:

### Ms. Schmitter-6th Grade Math:

Through the use of GetMore Math, students have been practicing concepts that are aligned to their misunderstanding and needs. They work through different problems to earn points. Once a certain amount is earned, they are able to play different math games. Students are finding a high interest and excitement for this practice!

**Mr. Manning-Math 6:** We have just finished up Positive Rational Numbers and are moving into Integers and Rational Number. We are in the new textbooks full time now and students seem to be adjusting nicely. Once a week my class is breaking up in collaborative groups for re-teaching and enrichment. During this time, the students work on a project or activity together based on our objectives. This time has been very beneficial to all students. I am hoping to see an improvement in overall performance on formatives.

**Ms. Camagos-6th Grade Math:** We spent October working on Decimal Operations and The Number System. We used several collaborative strategies to build relationships among students and started using google classroom for assessment and integrated online resources for practice and collaborative works.

**Ms. Larenio-7th grade:** We have been working on Percent's. We completed the retake on Unit Test 2 and made connections with the notes taken. We started setting up google classroom for every class. We also started with the new book this month.

8th grade: We finished the Linear Relationship lessons. We did a computer activity, and the flip book regarding the types of slopes and ways in finding for slope. Students worked on the Study Guide before they did the Unit test.

### Ms. Boldin: Unit 3: Linear Relationships

We have been working on slope, proportional and nonproportional relationships, similar triangles and writing slope in equations. We completed the Unit test and then began using the new textbooks.

**Mrs. Schultz-Pre-Algebra:** Moved through Topic 3 which had them working with Ratios and Proportions. We have now started our topic on percents.

Algebra completed the topic that involved linear equations. In the following topic they will apply their understanding of linear functions. As a whole, we have started Collaborative Study Groups. Students work together in groups to help further understanding on a lesson/question they are not understanding. These went AMAZING!! For it being their first time, students really utilized vocabulary and different questions to help students understand. No direct answers were given, rather students authentically worked through problems to solve for the answers.


We have enjoyed raising our children here in this community and living in this area full of fun recreational opportunities, which we have taken full advantage of, though my children would tell you we need to buy a boat.
