Oak Seed Preschool - Mrs. Lisa's Class



Week of December 9, 2019

The rain has finally arrived and so have the puddles and mud. Please help your child dress for wet weather so we can play outside and investigate the changes in our natural environment.

As we ease into the holiday season, our preschool class is going to make apple-spice ornaments to bring home. Here's the recipe:

- 1 cup ground cinnamon
- 1 cup applesauce
- 1/4 cup white school glue (Elmer's[®] works very well)

Preparing the Dough

- 1. Mix ground cinnamon with applesauce and white glue in a large mixing bowl.
- 2. If the mixture feels too stiff, add a drop of water.
- 3. Knead the clump together and wrap it in some plastic wrap, allowing it to sit for about an hour.

Working with the Dough

- 1. Take some dough and flatten it between two sheets of wax paper using your hands, or a rolling pin.
- 2. Make sure the dough isn't too thin you're best bet is to flatten it to 1/2'' or so thick.
- 3. Use your cookie cutters to create fun shapes in the dough.
- 4. Be sure to punch a hole in the top of each shape with a pencil, or press a paperclip in the back of the ornament while still wet to act as a hanger.

Drying or Baking the Ornaments

- 1. Once you have a few ornaments ready, place them on a cookie sheet.
- 2. You can either let them dry naturally over a period of 3 to 5 days, or you can bake them in an oven (adult assistance required!) at 200 degrees for about 2 hours (making sure you flip them halfway through).






Greetings,

We made an ornament this week, decorated the class tree, and look forward to our Holiday Concert and spending extra time with family soon.


