

THE MILITARY OFFICERS ASSOCIATION OF AMERICA (MOAA)  
SCHOLARSHIP PROCEDURES

General

1. A scholarship(s) will be awarded each year to an outstanding High School Senior(s) who shows a potential for making a significant contribution to society in the future. The Scholarship committee will consider academic achievement, involvement in school activities and community activities. Financial need will not be a consideration.
2. The number of qualified applicants and the amount of money allocated for scholarships in any given year will determine the amount and number of awards. The Scholarship committee will make this decision after all applications have been received. The committee also has the ability to make a scholarship to an applicant who documents a hardship that he/she has overcome in his/her high school years. This is known as "The Presidents Award."
3. Suitable publicity regarding the award(s), eligibility and source of application forms will be accomplished not later than January of the award year. Cut-off date for receipt of applications from candidates will be **March 15<sup>th</sup>**. The Scholarship committee will choose recipients and alternates by April 30<sup>th</sup> of the award year. The time and place of the presentation of the award will be at the discretion of the committee. The Scholarship Committee reserves the right to make all final decisions concerning the granting of all scholarships.

Eligibility: Graduating high school students of **active** duty or **retired** military families residing within the area of Northern Santa Barbara County are eligible. Students must attend the following High Schools to be considered by the Scholarship Committee; Lompoc, Cabrillo, Maple, Valley Christian, St. Joseph, Righetti, Orcutt Academy, Pioneer, and Santa Maria. **Students who apply for this scholarship must be in possession of a valid military ID card.** A photo copy of this ID must be included with the application.

Limitations:

1. Scholarships must be used at a four year accredited college/university or a two year accredited Community College (i.e. Allan Hancock, Cuesta, etc.) in the United States.
2. Scholarships must be used in the school year immediately following the date of the award unless special arrangements are made with the Scholarship Committee.
3. Scholarship money must be used for tuition, books and college related expenses.
4. Students accepting an appointment to a military academy become ineligible for this award. In this event, the scholarship will be given to an alternate.
5. Any unused portions of a scholarship award will be returned to the Scholarship Committee.
