In the latest national rankings released this week by US News & World Report, MSMHS was ranked #51 in Connecticut and was recognized nationally as a Bronze Medal School.

The national rankings are based upon 2012-2013 school data which was the second year of the school when our current seniors were sophomores. Rankings are based upon student to teacher ratio, AP test takers and pass rate (3 or higher), and state standardized test scores in reading and mathematics.

This ranking was a surprise to all of us at MSMHS. It is quite an accomplishment that MSMHS received national recognition without an AP test taker. With our AP program growing considerably each year, we are all excited to see what MSMHS will be ranked next year when our 2013-2014 AP test takers are taken into account. The future looks bright for a silver or even gold medal for MSMHS in 2016!
