School History: Largest Group of Student Council Reps Selected

GROTON, CT - Last Tuesday, students in each advisory group voted for up to three students to represent their advisory on the MSMHS Student Council. The selected students in each advisory wrote campaign letters to the Student Council Selection Committee who on Friday had to make the tough decision of selecting amongst the 67 incredible students and their impressive letters. The committee comprised of six faculty members listened to each letter read by Dr. Spera without knowing the name of the nominee. After meeting for over two hours reviewing the group of nominees representing over 24% of MSMHS, the committee ended up selecting the largest student council in MSMHS history with 42 total members (31 students in 2014-2015).

College Board SAT Day at MSMHS - October 14th

GROTON, CT - On October 14, all MSMHS students will be involved in a College Board standardized exam. In addition, MSMHS is paying for all fees associated with each exam.

All seniors will begin taking the SAT first thing in the morning so that the exam will finish before the end of the school day. Juniors and sophomores will take the PSAT exam. For juniors, this year's PSAT scores count towards the National Merit Corporation Programs.

Freshmen students will take the Pre-PSAT exam. Pre-PSAT results will provide detailed feedback on student performance, allowing teachers to see how well each student is performing in key academic areas. Moreover, students and parents can see how their skill levels compare to those of other students nationally.
