College Board SAT Day at MSMHS - October 19th



GROTON, CT - On October 19, all MSMHS students will be involved in a College Board standardized exam. In addition, MSMHS is paying for all fees associated with each exam.

All seniors will begin taking the SAT first thing in the morning so that the exam will finish before the end of the school day. Juniors and sophomores will take the PSAT exam. For juniors, this year's PSAT scores count towards the National Merit Programs. Freshmen students will take the Pre-PSAT exam. Pre-PSAT results will provide detailed feedback on student performance, allowing teachers to see how well each student is performing in key academic areas. Moreover, students and parents can see how their skill levels compare to other students nationally.
