	<ul> <li>Your child needs to read nightly for at least 30 minutes.</li> <li>Ask your child to summarize what he/she had read. Who, what, where, when, and why.</li> <li>Occasionally have your child read a page aloud to practice fluency.</li> <li>At the end of your child's book, ask him/her what they learned from the book or why the author wrote the story. (ex. What's the author's message?)</li> <li>Encourage your child: <ul> <li>to elaborate and add specific details to his/her writing.</li> <li>to read a variety of genres (ex: fiction, nonfiction, biographies, fantasy, poetry, etc.)</li> <li>to use conventions of grammar, punctuation, and spelling in writing.</li> <li>to write complete answers to reading comprehension questions using part of the question to begin the answer.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Comment:</li> </ul>

	Encourage students to: <ul> <li>practice multiplication math facts, especially 6-12's.</li> <li>practice division facts.</li> <li>visit Portaportal for grade level activities to reinforce math skills.</li> <li>visit Khan Academy to reinforce math skills.</li> <li>use math strategies discussed at school.</li> <li>engage in classroom mathematical discussions.</li> <li>complete math homework daily</li> </ul> Comment:
Goals to support your child's social and emotional growth.	<ul> <li>Talk with your child about his/her friendships.</li> <li>Be sure your child gets enough sleep; 8:30 is not too early, for 4<sup>th</sup>/5<sup>th</sup> graders. Research shows children need between 10 and 12 hours of sleep per night to support their development.</li> <li>Encourage your child to advocate for him/herself.</li> <li>Limit screen time and no screen time at least 30 minutes before bed.</li> <li>Ask your child questions like: What went well for you today? What could have gone better?</li> <li>Encourage your child to be respectful, kind, compassionate, and empathetic.</li> </ul>
