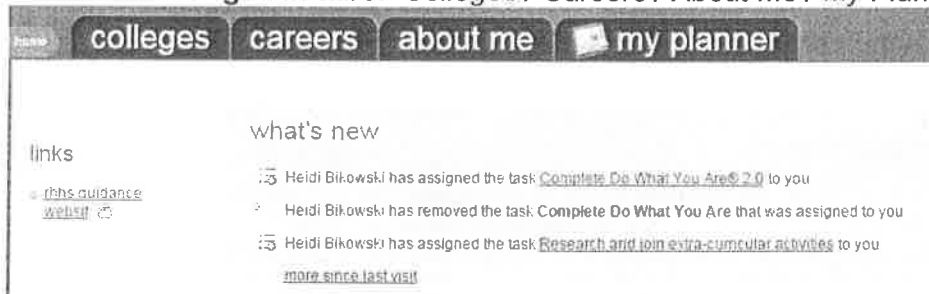


Naviance for Sophomores

Log into Naviance by going to <http://connection.naviance.com/rockyhill>

- Log in with your RHHS Gmail account
- If you forgot your password or have not logged into Naviance yet, please see your counselor.

Naviance is arranged in tabs: *Colleges / Careers / About Me / My Planner*



CAREERS

- Click on **CAREERS > CAREER INTEREST PROFILER**
- Select **START PROFILER**

Career Interest Profiler:

- To review results at a future time, click **CAREERS > CAREER INTEREST PROFILER**.
- Read results carefully. Scores will indicate in which of six career clusters your interests are the highest.
- Click on **View Matching Occupations** and read the information provided on at least 4-5 careers of interest to learn more about them – education/training required, etc. Remember that occupations are listed according to how much education and training they require, so work your way down the list.
- If you find specific careers or occupations you are interested in, select **Add to List** and this specific career/occupation will be saved under *Favorite Careers and Clusters* to reference at a later time.

DO WHAT YOU ARE – PERSONALITY-TYPE ASSESSMENT

- Click **CAREERS >>> DO WHAT YOU ARE**. Follow instructions to complete survey. If you see “Human eSources Do Way You Are will connect to your Family Connection Account...” Click **CONTINUE**.
- *Do What You Are* has a series of scenarios to read and determine which fits you best. Upon completion, your Personality Type will be displayed as 4 letters. Refer to chart below for what those letters represent:

How we interact with others:		
E = Extravert (More outgoing)	OR	I = Introvert (More reserved)
Information we naturally notice and remember:		
S = Sensors (More concrete)	OR	N = iNtuitives (More imaginative)
Decision-making:		
T = Thinkers (More logical)	OR	F = Feelers (More emotional)
How we live our lives or spend our time:		
J = Judgers (More structured)	OR	P = Perceivers (More spontaneous)

- Click on **VIEW FULL REPORT** to read a description of the personality, strengths and blind spots, college and career satisfiers, preferred learning style and interpersonal negotiation style.
- Click on **SEE RELATED CAREERS** for information on specific careers and majors.

CLUSTER FINDER:

- The *Cluster Finder* will help you learn which career clusters may be a good match for you based on activities that interest you, personal qualities that you have and subjects that you enjoy studying in school.
- Click **Let's Begin** to get started.

- Upon completion, a list is generated showing top career clusters. Click **Add this cluster to your list** for future reference under *Favorite Careers and Clusters*. Click on the cluster itself for more information.

EXPLORE CAREERS

Favorite Careers & Clusters

- As assessments are completed, there is the option of saving favorite careers and clusters from the assessments. Clicking **Favorite Careers & Clusters** brings students to this saved information.

Explore Careers and Clusters:

- Explore career options and get detailed information about possible career choices.
- Search careers by keyword, category or Holland Code (based on results from *Do What You Are*)
- Search careers by cluster or pathway

MY PLANNER

My Planner is where Student Success Plans are maintained. Students are assigned specific tasks to complete. Click on **Tasks Assigned to Me** to see a list of grade-specific tasks to be completed. Click on a task for more specifics.

To create and update individual goals, click on **Goals** and select **Other Goals** to add your academic and/or career goal. You can add as many goals as you wish. Follow instructions as noted.

Based on the results of the survey, **CIRCLE** your **THREE** strongest interests:

Realistic: Realistic occupations frequently involve work activities that include practical, hands-on problems and solutions. They often deal with plants, animals, and real-world materials like wood, tools, and machinery. Many of the occupations require working outside, and do not involve a lot of paperwork or working closely with others.

Investigative: Investigative occupations frequently involve working with ideas, and require an extensive amount of thinking. These occupations can involve searching for facts and figuring out problems mentally.

Artistic: Artistic occupations frequently involve working with forms, designs and patterns. They often require self-expression and the work can be done without following a clear set of rules.

Social: Social occupations frequently involve working with, communicating with, and teaching people. These occupations often involve helping or providing service to others.

Enterprising: Enterprising occupations frequently involve starting up and carrying out projects. These occupations can involve leading people and making many decisions. Sometimes they require risk taking and often deal with business.

Conventional: Conventional occupations frequently involve following set procedures and routines. These occupations can include working with data and details more than with ideas. Usually there is a clear line of authority to follow.
