Dear Willington Parents/Guardians, Staff and Community Members,

I am writing you to address the recent Chronicle articles regarding tuitioning our Willington students to Mansfield and the closing of the schools in Willington.

The first thing I would like to clarify is this is just one of several ideas that the Board of Education has been exploring over the past two years. It stems from the Board goal of trying to deal with the sustainability of our schools in the face of declining enrollments and increasing costs.

Some of the other options that had been explored include consolidation of the two schools into a single school. This option was eliminated since Hall Memorial School would be the only school potentially large enough to hold all of the students but the age of the building along with the renovation costs to make this happen did not make sense. I was also opposed to the idea of having our k-3 students in that building because of the layout of the building and the location on route 32.

We had also discussed the possibility of working with Ashford to share students and perhaps have one town take all of the elementary students and the other take the middle school students. This option was abandoned because there was no advantage for Ashford and there were some logistical problems because of transportation issues.

Another option was to build a new K-8 school in Willington and close both Hall Memorial and Center School. This option would save money through reduced staff, energy efficiencies and reduced costs associated with the maintenance of two old buildings. This option is something the Board of Education is still very interested in pursuing. The problem with this option is that although there would be savings it does not seem likely that the savings would cover the cost of the bond payment and in fact would probably result in several hundred thousand dollars in additional costs until the bond was paid. There would also be the dilemma of what to do with the current school buildings. If they could be repurposed and perhaps become a viable source of revenue via taxes it could help to offset the shortfall with regards to the bond payment. If not they would be a potential liability because they would still require some maintenance costs by the town.

The option that I am currently addressing is the option to tuition out all of our students to Mansfield and to close both of our schools. This option was originally dropped because the Superintendent in Mansfield had expressed no interest in pursuing the idea when I had first approached him about it over a year ago. Earlier this year when I had been meeting with the new Superintendent of Mansfield the topic of facility projects came up and she had Willington Parents/Guardians, Staff and Community Members May 20, 2016 Page two

explained that they were struggling with the issue of whether to close one of their elementary schools due to declining enrollment and that Mansfield was going to post a Request For Proposals for a facilities study in the Fall. I informed her of our Board goal and that I had approached Mansfield the prior year about the option of tuitioning our Willington students to Mansfield and that it had been rejected by the Superintendent. She expressed an interest in revisiting this option and we had several meetings to discuss if it was viable. The decision was made in April by the Willington Board of Education to formally request that we have a conversation about the option with Mansfield. In May we received a response from Mansfield that they were interested in pursuing this conversation.

I want to stress that this is simply the beginning of a conversation. We are currently in the process of getting representatives from each town's Board of Education, Board of Finance and the Selectman of Willington and the mayor of Mansfield to meet and see if there is any merit to the idea. We have a tentative date of June 6th for the first meeting. I do not have a time or location yet. The meeting will be a public meeting and there will be opportunity for the public to speak. I encourage you to follow the discussion, to attend a meeting if possible, and to contact my office with any opinions you might want the committee to hear. I want to reiterate it is only the start of a conversation. This type of cooperative arrangement will require support from both towns and would take years to come to fruition. I think we are a long way from that happening and wanted to make sure that the facts are coming from me rather than the newspaper.

Thank you for your continued support and cooperation.

I am very excited to welcome Mr. Craig to our community and am certain that he will bring a great deal of energy and school spirit to Hall Memorial.




