Adrian Cline re-elected as superintendent

Superintendent Adrian H Cline was reelected on November 8th and reclaimed his office November 22nd to a historic seventh term as superintendent of DeSoto County High Schools.

Before Cline was superintendent, he was born and raised in Arcadia, and attended DeSoto High School graduating in 1967. While in high school he was involved in Honor Society, Rotary, and was also in Interact. A year after graduation Cline joined the Air Force and was only stationed in Florida but would sometimes go to other Air Force bases in the country. In the Air Force he also worked as a computer engineer. He served for four years then went to college at the University of South Florida.

Cline has a very strong education and graduated with a bachelor's degree in English education and a master from NOVA in education. He became an English teacher after college in 1978. He was heavily influenced by one of his English teachers who made him really enjoy learning. Cline's teaching career began in Sarasota County but came to DeSoto County after a year in Sarasota. Cline worked his way up to become an assistant principal of the high school. He then moved to the position of being principal here in 1982.

The DeSoto County native began his first year as superintendent in 1988. He was superintendent for 24 years until he retired. However, he came back to return as superintendent for his 7th term. "Some people are suited for retirement and others are not." Cline said.

Three of his main goals as superintendent is to reduce dropout rate, see academic

performances improve, and provide teachers with the right resources. He has already began configuring administration staff and also made sure that there are resources in the right areas.

Cline believes the strengths of DeSoto County Schools mainly revolve around this small town and its families. Because of Arcadia's small size many people are close with each other and have grown up with each other. "This can also be said for the students in DeSoto who are family oriented and develop their character much earlier than they would in a large town" Cline said. The veteran teachers also benefit from the small town according to Cline. The teachers know the families of the students well and are able to have better communication with

them. Some of them will even tackle more than one job at the school.

Outside of Cline's career he enjoys

reading and collecting memorabilia on Franklin D. Roosevelt. One of his favorite authors is F. Scott Fitzgerald, whose is the renowned author of "The Great Gatsby". Cline commented saying that Fitzgerald is an excellent writer and his stories are mostly a reflection of the 20's. When it comes to relaxing although he does not enjoy the beach much, his wife, Jane S. Cline, and his family will often vacation in Siesta Keys. One of his favorite movies is "Dr. Zhivago". "Every frame in that movie was perfect.". Cline does not get to his hobbies as often as he would like but he does spend almost every weekend collecting artifacts and reading articles on Franklin D. Roosevelt.

"There is no stopping point with education; it should continue everyday of your life." said the superintendent. Cline will be serving as superintendent for the next four years.
