Course Description:

The grade 9-12 Economics course consists of the following content area strands: Economics and Geography. The primary content emphasis for this course pertains to the study of the concepts and processes of the national and international economic systems. Economic content should include, but is not limited to, the fundamental concepts relevant to the major economic systems, the global market and economy, major economic theories and economists, the role and influence of the government and fiscal policies, and economic measurements, tools, and methodology. The personal finance literacy portion of the course will cover topics including saving and investing, credit cards and credit scores, wages and taxes, budgeting, major purchases, employment, and insurance.

Course Goals/Expectations (Face-to-Face & Virtual):

After successfully completing this course, the student will...

- demonstrate an understanding of the elements of American Government
- demonstrate effective use of communication skills
- demonstrate effective use of planning and decision-making skills

Course Materials:

Supplies – Both Face-to-Face and Virtual students should bring the following to class each day: laptop, headphones, pencil, pen, loose-leaf notebook paper, and a composition book for notes. Other supplies (colored pencils/markers) may be requested for special assignments.

Absentees/Tardiness:

Rather Face-to-Face or Virtual, the regular presence and punctuality of students is necessary for successful completion of this course. Students must be in their seats before the tardy bell rings. If you are a virtual student, you should be in a quiet location and logged into the Google Classroom/Google Meet session at the start of class. When a student has been tardy or absent from class three times, parents will be contacted to determine and correct the problem. Appropriate school staff will also be contacted. It is the student's responsibility to request makeup exams and missed assignments due to excused absences and/or tardiness. Students have one day per absence to request and complete make up work, up to ten absences. Missed assignments should be completed

and turned in as instructed. Makeup work and tests may or may not be the same as original assignments. Please become familiar with attendance and tardy policies located in the Student Code of Conduct Handbook.

Classroom Participation:

Both Face-to-Face and Virtual students are expected to participate in all classroom activities. This includes discussions, written classroom assignments, project/group activities, oral presentations, quizzes, tests, etc. Students are also expected to complete and submit homework as assigned. To reduce possible transmission of Covid-19, all assignments in this course will be issued and returned via Google Classroom. All assignments will have a due date attached to them and Google Classroom will automatically mark it late if submitted after the announced deadline. Except for tests/quizzes/projects, all other assigned work is due at the start of your class period. All late assignments are automatically deducted 10 points per day.
